## BANK DEBITS TO INDIVIDUAL ACCOUNTS

or
Amount of Cheques Chargea Against Bank hccounts at the Clearing House Centres November, 1929

Financial transfers showed recession in November from the totals of the same month of 1928 and, after adjustment for seasonal tendencies, from the high total of the preceding month. Bank debits, the amount of cheques charged to accounts in the clearing house centres of Caneda, totalled $\$ 4,177,000,000$ during November, or 5.6 p.c. less than in the same month of 1928. Declines of 19.8 p.c. and 8.2 f.c. were shown in the Prairie Provinces and Ontario, respectively. The gain in quebec province was 5.5 p.c., while the Maritime Provinces showed a gain of 7.9 p.c. British Columbia had a gain of $2.8 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. over the same month of last year.

## Debits in the Eieven Months

Despite the drop of rearly $6 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. in November, the cumulative total for the first eleven months of 1929 was $8.2 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. greater than in the same period of 1928. Gains were shown ir each of the economic areas with the exception of the Prairie Provinces, where the recession was less tian one half of one per cent. The gain in British Columbia was $19 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. and Quebec showed an increase $0 \mathrm{i}^{\prime} 10.8 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. over the high total of 1928. The rise in the debits of ontario was 8.5 p.c., and the Naritime Provircos showed an advance of 8.2 p.c.

## Turnover of Bank Deposits

The percentage of debits to bank deposits in Canada was 185.4 p.c. in November compared with 199.1 in November, 1928. In the inturval bank deposits had shown an increase, while as noted above, bank debits were somewhat less.

## Comparison with vember, 1928

Debits were greater in November than during the same month of 1928 in the three centres of the Maritime Provinces, the net result being an increase of 7.9 p.c.

Debits in Montreal at $\$ 1,371,000,000$ were up $6.5 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$., while Quebec and Sherbrooke showed declines. The aggregate $f 0$ o the province was 5.5 p.c. greater than in the same month of last year.

Seven of the 12 centres in Cntario showed declires in November, the debits in Toronto being off $7.8 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. The total amount for the province at $\$ 1,627,000,000$ showed a decline of 8.2 p.c.

Though five aentres in the Frairiu Provinces showed gains, the aggregate for the area was down 19.8 p.c. Debits ir Winnipeg at $\$ 514,600,000$ were 25.8 p.c. less than in November of last year.

Vancouver ard New westminster showed gairs, the net result for Briti sh Columbia being a gain of $2.8 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$.
