## BANK DEBITS TO INDIVIDUAL ACCOUNTS

## or

## Amount of Cheques Charged hgainst Bank Accounts at the Clearing House Centres Aug ust. 19k9

Bank debits were 13 p.c. greater in August thar in the same month of last year, according to the statistics furnished to the Dominion Bureau ol Statistics by the Canadian Bankers' Association. The aggregate for the Dominion in August was $\$ 3,667,070,000$ compared with $\$ 3,243,100,000$ in August, 1928. Each of the economic areas showed advances in the month under review over the corresponding month of 1928. Debits in Ontario were 15 p.c. greater, while the gain in \&uebec was nearly 1. p.c. The advance in British Columbia was about 13 p.c. Substantial gains were also shown in the Prairie Frovinces and the Waritimes, tho increases beirg 8.5 p.c. and $6 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$., respectively.

## Bank Dobits in the First Eight Months

The cumulative tctals for the first eight months of the present year were 9.5 F.c. greater than in the same period of 1928 , the total in 1929 being $\$ 30,506,500,000$ compared with $\$ 27,850,700,000$. British Columbia showed the greatest percentage gain in this connection, the increase being $21.6 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. The debits of Ontario during the first eight ret nths were $\$ 12,415,500,000$ compared with $\$ 11,061,000,000$ in the same period of 1928 , an increase of $12 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. Quebec and the Maritimes showed gains of slightly more than 8 p.c. aach. Debits in the Prairis Provinces exhibited the moderate gain of nearly 2 p.c.

## Comparisonwith Juiv, 1929

Canadian bank debits in fugust were about \& p.c. less than in Juiy last when the total was $\$ 4,004,000,000$. The decline in August from the July total is normally about $7 \mathrm{p} . c$. After adjustment for seasonal tendencies, the decline irom the level of July was thus restricted to $1 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. Winnipeg with debits of $\$ 428,800,000$ showed after seasoral. adjustment a gain of 22.3 p.c. A moderate gain was apparent in Toronto, while declines were experienced in Montreal and Vancouver. As speculative activity, judged by the number of shares traded on the Montresil Stock Exchange, was much greater in August than in July, the slight decline in debits after seasonal sdjustment indicates a moderate recession of business in the latter part of the summer.

## Turnover of Bank Deposits

The turnover of bank deposits denotirg the ratio of debits to deposits was 171.0 p.c. in August. The ratio in August last year was $150.0 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. The greuter turnover is generally regarded as indicating more active speculative and business conditions.

## Ratio to Bunk Clearings

The ratio of kank debits to bank cluarir.gs was 181.0 in agust compared with 171.9 p.c. in August last year. Bank amalgamations over any considerable period huve had a depressing effect on bsink clearings which are therefore of minor value in the interpretation of the long-term trend of business.
