## BAIK DEBIT'S TO INDIVIDUAL ACCOUNTS, NOVEIBER, 1931

## i.

Financial transfers in the form of bank debits showed, after seasonal adjust-
ment, i. gain of 8.5 p.c. in Novembur from the level of the preceding month. The total Was $\$ 2,841,800,000$ in the month under review compared with $\$ 2,586,900,000$ in October. Debits are usually higher in Noverber than in any other month of the year, while in the present case the gain over October was greater then normal for the season. The gain if or the Dominior during Novernber compared with the preceding month was due mainly to higher levels in Ontario and the Prairie Provinces, while increases were also shown in the Maritimes a nd British Columbia. In Montreal and the province of quebec, after seasonal adjustment, recessions were shorn of 12.5 p.c. and 11.9 p.c., respectively.

## The gain in the llaritime Provinces aftor seasonal adjustment

was 10.6 p:c. Gains were recorded in Hulfax waint John, while Moncton showed a decline. Debits in Ontario were $\$ 1,133,800,000$ compared with $\$ 1,026,800,000$ in the preceding month, tine gain after seasonal adjustront boing $4.8 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. The increase in Toronto with seasonal adjustment was $5.9 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$., gains being shown in eight centres out of the thirteen in the province. At $\$ 686,600,000$, debits in the Prairie Provinces showed, after seasonal adjustment, a gain of $32.8 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. Increases were general in the ten centres of the economic area, with the excaption of Medicine Hat and Lethbridge, the gain in Winnipeg being $46.4 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. The increase, after seasonal adjustment, in British Columbia was 17.5 p.c., the otal ir November being $\$ 160,700,000$ compared with $\$ 134,300,000$ in October.

## Total sfor tie Eirst Eleven Months

Bank debits in Caneda Curing the first eleven months of 1931 were $\$ 28,948,000,000$ conpared with $\$ 34,479,000,000$ in the sane period of 1930, a decline of 16 p.c. The decline in the Maritime frovinces was $8 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. The total in Guebec was $\$ 9,776,000,000$ compared with $\$ 12,132,000,000$, a decline of $19.6 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. The Ontario total of $\$ 12,183,000,000$ showed a docline of 11.5 p.c. Debits in the three Prairie Provinces recorded a decrease of 18 p.c., while the total in British Columbia was 23 p.c. less.

## Comparison with November, 1930

Debits in Canada were 4.4 p.c. Ic ss in November than in the same month of 1930, the total of $\$ 2,841,800,000$ comparing with $\$ 2,973,600,000$. Gains in this comparison were shown in the Prairic Provinces and in the Naritimes, the increases being $24 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. and $3.6 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. respectivaly. Declines were severe in the province of quebec, the drop being 21.7 p.c. The total in liontreal was $\$ 734,500,000$ compared with $\$ 947,600,-$ 000 in November, 193C, a decline of $22.5 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. Declines were fairly general in the clearing centres of ontario, the net recult being a decline of 2.6 p.c. The gain in the aggregate in the Prairie Provinces was 24.0 ., the increse in Winnipeg being 55 p.c. The declinc in Vancouver was 11.4 p.c., while British Columbia showed a drop of $6.2 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$.

## Turnover of Bank Deposits

The ratio of bank debits to deposits as at the end of the preceding month was 139.1 p.c. compared with 143.0 Y.c. in the same month of last year. Bank deposits at $\$ 2,042,900,000$ showed a decline of about I p.c., while debits showed a decline of $4.4 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$.

## Comparison with Other Factors

The gain in bank debits. Attar seasonal adjustment, was 8.5 p.c. from the level of october. The index of udustrial production, a weighted average indicating the composite trend of forestry, mining, manufacturing and construction was 125.0 in Novernoer compared with 230.5 in the preceding month, a decrease of $4.5 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. The gain in the index of wholesale prices was from $70.4 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}_{6}$ to 70.6 . The decline in industrial employment during November, after suasonal adjustment, was $1.6 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. The gener al index of common stocks was 71.9 in $N_{0} v$ ercier compared with 646 , an increase of 11.4 p.ct The shares traded on the Montreal Stock exchange numbered 431,758 in November compared with 308,888 in October, a gain of noarly $40 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$.
