Tinancial transfers in the form of bank debits after seasonal adjustment were 12 p.c. greater in Webruary than in the first month of the year. The gain in February vas due to :hoderate improvement in business operations as well as greater activity and nigher rices on the stock exchangus. hfter seasonal adjustment, the increases in iontroal and Wimipeg yore 9.5 p.c. and $11 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$., respectively. The debits in Toronto were nuarly maintainod, while Vancouvor showed a declino of $5.3 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. The gain for the throe centres of the rovincos of quebec, af tor adjustment, was 9.7 p.c. and the Prairio Frovincos showd a gain of $7.6 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. hfter adjustment for seasonal tendencius, debits in oach of the throu other oconoric areas were practically maintained.

## Dobits in the First Tyo Honths

Total dejits in the first two months of the year were $\$ 5,203,000,000$ compared with $\$ 6,026,000,000$ in the sane months of 1930 , a decline of $14.7 \mathrm{p} \cdot \mathrm{c}$. The Waritime Provinces and vuebec furing the first two months of the year showed declines of 6.0 p.c. and 8.2 p.c., respectively. Debits of Ontario in the first two months at $\$ 2,235,000,000$ were $10.6 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. less than in the same period of 1930. The declines in the destern arcas were more extentive, the drop in the Prairie Provinces and in British Columbia being 20.2 p.c. and 2.0 p.c., respectively.

## Comparison sith February, 1930

Except in Saint John, N.B., declines ware general in the 32 clearing centres of Cunadu furing February from the levels of the same month of last year. The total at $\$ 2,535,000,000$ corpared with $\$ 2,815,000,000$ in February 1930 was about 10 p.c. less. The delits in Saint John were $\$ 22,472,000$ compared with $\$ 17,246,000$ in the same month of 1930, a gain of moro than $30 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. Halifax and Moncton showed declines, the net cosult for the Naritime Provinces being a recession of $1.2 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$.

Dubits in Montreal were $\$ 870,491,000$, a decline of 1.3 p.c. in this comperison, and the total in the province declinod by a similar purcontage.

Declines were general in the 13 centres of Ontario, Toronto showing a declino of $1 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. The drop in the agerggate for the province was $7.5 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$.

The debits in the centres of the Prairio Provinces amounted to \$341,166,000 compared with $4772,150,000$, a doclino of $27.6 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$., while tho drop in Winnipug was $30.6 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$.

The ascline in the thrce centres of Eritish Columbia was 25.3 p.c., Vancouver showing a drop of 29.0 P.c.

## Turnover of Bank Doposits

The turnovor of bank doposits was less in Fobruary thea in the sumo nonth of last yoar, the percentagu of debits to bank cieposits as at tho last day of the precuding month was 127.7 in Peoruary compare with 135.0 in tho same month of 1930. In the interval tho sum of the coman and notice doposits duclined $4.7 \mathrm{p} \cdot \mathrm{c}$., fhile debits wors about 10 p. . Iass.

## Comparison with Othor Factors

As statud abovo, the gain aftor soasonal adjustment in bank dobits in Tobruary aver tho procoding month was about $12 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. The indox of industrial production, a veight. od avtrajo indicating the composito trand of forcstry, mining, manufacturing and construction, was $1 \% 5.6$ in tho month under roviow comparod with 141.7 in tho procoding month, a gain of 2.0 . Thu duclinu in the index of wholusalo prices mas from 76.7 to 76.0 , or about I ..c. The decline in industrial omployment during Fobruary, ufter suasomal Wjustrunt, wes about if.c. The gonoral indox of common stocks was 111.6 in Fobruiry compare with 106.9 , a gin of 4.5 pace . The shares iradod on the liontrual exchangu numbured 706,607 compared with 377,241 in January.
