## EANK DEBITS TO IIDIVIDUAL ACCOUNTS

or
Anount of Chogues Charged against Bank Accounts at the
Clearing House Centres, March, 1931
Bank debits, after seasonal adjustment, showed gains in Ontario and British Columiaia ciuring March over the levels of the preceding month, while declines were indicated in Uuebec and the Prairie Provinces. The total for the Maritime Provinces, after seasonal adjustment, was practically maintained. The net result for the Dominion was a cecine of $9.2 \mathrm{f} . \mathrm{c}$ : after the usual adjustment. Debits in the clearing centres of the country as a whole were $\$ 2,570,400,000$ compared with $\$ 2,534,900,000$ in February, but the total for March is normally much greater than in February, and the actual increase was less than usual according to the experience with bank debits irom 1924 to 1930. Debits in montreal were $\$ 848,000,000$ in Warch compared with $\$ 870,000,000$ in the preceding month, a decline of $2.2 \mathrm{p} d \mathrm{c}$ : after seasomal adjustment. The decline in the province of quebec after adjustment was 2.6 p.c.

The total in Tor onto was $\$ 824,000,000$ in March compared with $\$ 803,500,000$, a gain ufter seasonal adjustment of $7.6 \mathrm{\rho} . \mathrm{c}$. and the gain in Ontario under like conditions was 3 p.c. The decline in the Prairie Provinces, after adjustment for seasonal tendencies, was $17.4 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. , and the drop in Winnipeg was also considerable. The gain in Vancouver in this comparison was 4.5 p.c. and the total for British Columbia showed an increase of 3.3 p.c.

## Debits in the First Quarter

Total debits in the first quarter of the present year were $\$ 7,774,000,000$ compared with $\$ 9,118,000,000$ in the same period of 1930 , a decline of $15.2 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. The decline in tine Saritime Provinces was $5.5 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. The total in the province of Quebec during the first quarter was $\$ 2,742,000,000$, a decline of $11.3 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. Ontario showed a decline of 11. 4 p.c., the total for the first cuarter of 1931 being $\$ 3,350,000,000$. The debits in tic Prairie Provinces were down 28 g.c. and British Columbia snowed a decline of 23 p.c.

## Comparison with idarch, 1930

The decline of Canadian bank debits was nearly $17 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. in Narch from the level of the same month of 1930. The total of $\$ 2,570,000,000$ in March compares with $\$ 3,092,-$ 000,000 in March 1930. The three centres of the Naritime Provinces showed a decline of 4.5 p.c. In Quebec the decline was $16.9 \mathrm{p.c}$. , Montreal showing a drop of $17.8 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. The decline in Ontario was 9.8 p.c., Ottawe being the only centre showing a gain. The debits of Toronto shomed a drop of $12.9 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. The doclines in Winnipeg and the Prairie Provinces were 27.7 p.c. and 30.9 p.c., respectively. The drop in the combined total for the three centres of British Coluribia wes $19.2 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$., the decline in Vancouver boing 20.4 p.c.

## Turnover of Bank Deposits

The turnover of bank deposits was less in March than in the same month of last year, this percentage of debits to bank deposits as at the last day of the preceding month being 130.0 in March conpared with 152.0 in the same month of 1930. In the meantime, the sur of the demand and notice deposits declined 4.0 p.c., mhile debits were nearly 17 p.e. less.

## Comparison with Other Pactors

The decline in bank debits, aftar seasonal adjustment, was 9.2 p.c. from the leve of February: The index of industrial production, a weighted average indicating the corposite trend of forestry, mining, manufacturing and construction, was 153.1 in Narch comparci with 145.6 in the preceding month, a gain of more than 5 p.c. The decline in tre incox of wholesale prices was from 76.0 to 75.1 or more than 1 p.c. The gair in iniu:urial mElomont duEng March after seasonal adjustment was about l p.c. Mine general inour oi comon stochs was Ilc. 8 in March compared with Il1.6, a decline of 0.7 p.c. Th shares twasoa on the pontreal stock exchange numbered 605,696 compared with 706,60 in Foctuary.
