

## BANK DEETTS TO INDIVIDUAL ACCOUNTS, JUIE, 1931

Bank debits showed a decline in June, reflecting the economic inactivity of the month. Financial transfers in this form amounted to $\$ 2,693,500,000$, a decline, aiter seasonal adjustment, of 10.4 p.c. from Kay. Declines were pronounced in Quebec province, where the provincial total, af ter seasonal adjustment, dropped 27.2 pic, the decline in Nontreal amounting to $31.4 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. The total for the Naritime Provinces showed a decline of $6 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. in this comparison. The drop in ontario amounted to 10.4 p.c., while Toronto showed a decline of 14.2 p.c.

The short-term comparison in the western areas was more favourable, the Prairie Provinces, after seasonal adjustment, showing a gain of 4.7 p.c. A similar percontage gain was registered in winnipeg. The debits of British Columbia at $\$ 156,500,000$ showed a gain of 8.1 p.c., after the usual adjustrient, and the city of Vancouver also showed an increase of about $8 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$.

## Comparison with June, 1930

Bank debits of $\$ 2,693,500,000$ in June compare with $\$ 3,397,700,000$ in the sume month of 1930, a decline of $20.7 \mathrm{p}, \mathrm{c}$. Each of the 32 centres, with the exception of Falifax and Ottawa, showed declines in this comparison. The decline in the aggregate for the Raritime Provinces was $8.1 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. Debits of Miontreal at $\$ 798,000,000$ showed a decline of $30.3 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$., and the net result for the Province was a drop of $25.2 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. Toronto showed a decline of 12.6 p.c. and Ontario was 11.7 p.c. less. Debits in the Prairie Provinces were 25.1 p.c. less than in the same month of 1930 and Winnipeg showed a declino of $21.7 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. The debits in the thre centres in British Columbia were $\$ 156,500,000$, a decline of $20.1 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. from June of last year. The decline in Vancouver was 17.9 p.c.

## Comparison with the First Half of 1930

Bank debits in Canada during the first half of 1931 were $\$ 16,425,000,000$, a decline of $13.7 \mathrm{~F} . \mathrm{c}$. from the same period of last year. Declines were genoral in the five economic areas of Canada. The liaritime Provinces made relatively the best showing, the recession being limited to $5.7 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. The drop in Quebec was $14.7 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c} .$, while Ontario showed a decline of 8.2 ..c. Declines in the Prairie Provinces and Eritish Columbia were $21.5 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. and $24.3 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. , respectively.

## Turnover of Bank Doposits

The turnover of bank deposits was less in June than in the same month of last year, the percentage of debits to bank deposits as at the last day of the preceding month being 132.3 in June compared with 169.4 in the same month of 1930. In the meantime, the sum of the demand and notice deposits increased $1.5 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$., while bank debits were $20.7 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. less.

## Comparison with Other Factors

The decline in bark debits, after seasonal adjustment, was 10,4 p.c. from the level of May. The index of industrial production, a weighted average indicatiag the composite trend of forestry, minirg, manufacturing and construction, was 133.9 in June compared with 158.2 in the precoding month, a decline of $15.4 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. The decline in the index of wholesale prices was from $73 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. to 72.2 , or slightly more than $1 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. The decline in industrial employment during June, aiter seasonal adjustment, ras 1.7 p.c. The general index of cormon stocks was 80.1 in June compared with 81.4, a decline of $1.5 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. The shares traded on the Montroal stock exchange numbered 528,093 in June "ompared with 851,426 in May.
