BANK DEBBITS TO INDIVIDUAL ACCOUNTS, DECEMBER, 1932.
Financial transfers in the form of bank debits in the thirty-two clearing centres of Canada amounted to $\$ 2,084,600,000$ in December, compared with $\$ 2,466,300,000$, in November, the decline after seasonal adjustment being 12.3 p.c. The Maritime Provinces showed a decline of 11.8 p.c. in the same comparison. Debits in quebec were $\$ 606,100,000$ compared with $\$ 709,730,000$ in November, the decline after seasonal adjustmont being 18.6 p.c. A similar percentage decline was shown in Montreal. The total for Ontario was $\$ 903,800,000$ in Decomber compared with $\$ 1,158,500,000$ in the preceding month. an adjustod decline of 25.4 p.c. Debits in Toronto were $\$ 672,000,000$ representing a drop of 26.2 p.c. The decline after seasonal adjustment in the Prairie Provinces. was limited to 1.3 p.c., Winnipeg showing a recession of 0.5 p.c. Debits in British Columbia at $\$ 125,265,000$ showed a decline of $3.1 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$., Vancouver recording a drop of $5.2 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$.

Comparison with 1931
The dollar volume of business in the clearing centres of Canada was $\$ 25,844,000,000$ in 1932 compared with $\$ 31,586,000,000$ in the preceding year, a decline of 18.2 p.c. The Maritime Provinces recorded a drop of 20.4 p.c., the total in 1932 boing $\$ 519,171,0 c 10$. Dobits in Quebec were $\$ 7,766,200,000$ in the year under review compared with $\$ 10,550,000,000$, a docline of 26.4 p.c. Montreal debits were $\$ 7,135.500,000$ compared $\nabla i t h ~ \$ 9,756,800,000$, representing a drop of 26.9 p.c. Debits in Ontario werc $\$ 11,259,000,000$ during 1932 compared with $\$ 13.377,000,000$, a deciine of 15.8 p.e. The showing in the Prairie Provinces mas relatively bettor than in the other conomic areas, the declinc being limited to $7.8 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. The total in the three provinces mos $\$ 4,797,000,000$ comparod aith $\$ 5,201,000,000$ in 1931. Regina was the only. centre of the thirtymtwo roporting centres to skow a gain in 1932 over the preceding year. Debits in that city mero $\$ 462,876,000$ comparod mith $\$ 412,700,000$, a gain of 12.2 p.c. The decline in Winnipeg mas limited to 4.3 p.c. Debits in British Columbia mere $\$ 1,502,800,000$ comparod with $\$ 1,805,800,000$, a decline of $16.8 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. The decline in Vancouver was 16 p.c., the total being $\$ 1,190,500,000$ compared with $\$ 1,416,000,000$.

Comparison: 71 th December, 1931
Dobits were 21.0 p.c. less in December last than in the same month of 1931, the total being $\$ 2,084,600,000$ compared with $\$ 2,638,000,000$. The Maritime Provinces showed a decline of 31.4 p.c., while the drop in the province of Quebec was 21.7 p.c. Deuits in Toronto were $\$ 672,000,000$ compared with $\$ 749,000,000$ in December 1931, a decline of $10.3 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. The total for the province was down 24.3 p.c. Winnipeg debits 7ere $\$ 281,739,000$ compared 7ith $\$ 271,118,000$, a gain of nearly 4 p.c. The total for the Prairie Provinces declined 10.4 p.c. Debits in British Columbia were 19 p.c. less, the docline in Vancouvor boing 18.8 p.c.

## Thurnover of Bank Deposits

The ratio of bank debits in December to bank deposits at the end of the proceding month was 112.6 p.c. compared with 131.1 p.c. in December, 1931, indicating for the present tine a low lovel of business and speculative activity combined with reduced prices. In the moantime, deposits showed a decline of about $8 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. , while debits were down 21 p.c.

## Corparison with Other Factors

Baik dobits, aftor adjustment for seasonal tendencies dropped to a nor $10 \pi$ point in Deconbor, the indor on the base of 1926 being 72.1 compared $\quad$ 位 32.3 in Movernber. The indox of the physienl volume of business shomed a decline of about 3 points, the standing in November being 75.8. Comodity prices reached lower levels in Decerber, the index receding 0.8 points from 64.8 in November. The index of cormon stocks was 51.3 compared with 53.4 in Novomber and the sale of shares on the Montreal Stock Exchange mas at a loter level.
