

COMMERCIAL FAILURES IN CANADA IN OCTOBER, 1933.

A considerable decrease in the number of assignments under the Bankruptcy and Winding Up Acts, as reported to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics, was recorded in October, 1933, as compared with October, 1932, while the liabilities of the assignors also showed a decrease. Commercial failures numbered 144, as compared with 199 in the same month of the previous year and 155 in September, 1933. The estimated liabilities of the assignors, amounting to \$2,321,926 as compared with \$3,439,220 in October, 1932, showed a large decrease; when compared with \$2,344,568 in September, 1933, a slight decrease is also noted.

COMMERCIAL FAILURES BY AREAS

Maritime Provinces.- In the month under review, there were 3 assignments in the Maritime Provinces, as compared with 7 in September, 1933, and 15 in October, 1932, a decrease being noted in both comparisons. The liabilities in October, 1933, were about \$44,000.

Quebec.- Commercial failures in the province of Quebec numbered 78 during October, 1933, as against 80 in September, 1933, and 80 in October, 1932. The liabilities were approximately \$1,196,000. In the city of Montreal, there were 44 failures with defaulted liabilities of about \$651,000.

Ontario.- In Ontario, the failures numbered 43, as against 45 in September, 1933, and 73 in October, 1932, a very decided decrease being noted in this latter more significant comparison. Liabilities aggregated about \$882,000. Of these 43 failures, 9 with estimated liabilities of about \$375,000 occurred in the city of Toronto.

Prairie Provinces.- In the three Prairie Provinces, failures increased from 16 in September, 1933, to 17 in October, 1933, and may be compared with 26 in October, 1932. A striking decrease is noted in this latter comparison. Liabilities aggregated about \$155,000. There were 3 failures with liabilities of about \$30,000, in the city of Winnipeg.

British Columbia.- In British Columbia, commercial failures numbered 3 as against 7 in September, 1933, and 5 in October, 1932, a decrease being noted in both comparisons. The liabilities were in the neighbourhood of \$45,000. The 3 failures reported for the Pacific Province took place in the city of Vancouver.

FAILURES BY BRANCHES OF BUSINESS

Trade.- Trading establishments furnished the largest number of failures, 80 assigning in October, 1933, as compared with 87 in September, 1933, and 92 in October, 1932. A decrease is noted in both comparisons. Of those concerns, 16 were general stores, 11 groceries, 3 drink and tobacco, 6 fish and meat, 3 boots and shoes, 3 dry goods, 10 clothing, 3 automobile, 5 hardware, 3 coal and wood and 3 drugs and chemicals.

Manufactures.- Manufacturing establishments to the number of 15 assigned in October, 1933, as against 20 in September, 1933, and 19 in October, 1932. The 15 included 5 engaged in the manufacture of vegetable foods, 1 in animal foods, 1 in furs and leather, 3 in clothing, and 2 in lumber and its manufactured products.

Agriculture.- Agriculturists assigning in October, 1933, numbered 6, as compared with 12 in September, 1933, and 19 in October, 1932, a remarkable decrease being noted in the latter comparison.

Services.- In services, the failures numbered 16 as compared with 18 in September, 1933, and 27 in October, 1932.

Miscellaneous.- There were 7 failures in construction, 1 in mining and 3 in finance.

CUMULATIVE TEN MONTHS' TOTAL OF FAILURES AND LIABILITIES

The cumulative total of commercial failures for the first ten months of 1933 was 1,729 as compared with 1,995, 1,807 and 1,941 for the same periods of 1932, 1931 and 1930 respectively. A considerable decrease is noted when compared with the same period of the three preceding years. The total failures in trade in the first ten months of 1933 were 920 as compared with 964, 897 and 977 for the same periods of 1932, 1931, and 1930, respectively. In manufacturing, 312 failures in the elapsed period of 1933 may be compared with 387, 388 and 395 in the same periods of the three preceding years. The defaulted liabilities for the first ten months of 1933 were \$28,669,253, as compared with \$34,506,706, \$45,260,019 and \$40,565,515 for the same periods of the three preceding years. Thus, defaulted liabilities showed a considerable decrease in the 1933 period as compared with the same periods of any of the three preceding years.
