

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COMMERCIAL FAILURES IN CANADA IN SEPTEMBER, 1933.

A considerable decrease in the number of assignments under the Bankruptcy and Winding Up Acts, as reported to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics, was recorded in September, 1933, as compared with September, 1932, while the liabilities of the assignors also showed a decrease. Commercial failures numbered 155, as compared with 193 in the same month of the previous year, and 150 in August, 1933. The estimated liabilities of the assignors, amounting to \$2,344,568 as compared with \$2,979,544 in September, 1932, showed a decrease when compared with \$2,357,510 in August, 1933, a slight decrease is also noted.

COMMERCIAL FAILURES BY AREAS

Maritime Provinces. - In the month under review, there were 7 assignments in the Maritime Provinces, as compared with 4 in August, 1933, and 9 in September, 1932, a decrease being noted in the latter comparison. The liabilities in September, 1933, were about \$26,000.

Quebec. - Commercial failures in the province of Quebec during September, 1933, numbered 80 as against 76 in August, 1933, and 90 in September, 1932. A marked decrease is noted in this latter comparison. The liabilities were approximately \$1,360,000. Of these 80 failures, 37 with estimated liabilities of about \$548,000 occurred in the city of Montreal.

Ontario. - In Ontario, the failures numbered 45 as against 55 in August, 1933, and 72 in September, 1932, a very decided decrease being noted in this latter more significant comparison. Liabilities aggregated about \$710,000. In the city of Toronto, there were 8 assignments with liabilities of about \$240,000.

Prairie Provinces. - In the three Prairie Provinces, failures increased from 14 in August, 1933, to 16 in September, 1933, and may be compared with 21 in September, 1932, a marked decrease being noted in this latter comparison. Liabilities aggregated \$170,000. There were 2 failures with liabilities of about \$12,000 in the city of Winnipeg.

British Columbia. - In British Columbia, commercial failures numbered 7 as against 1 in August, 1933, and 9 in September, 1932. The liabilities were \$79,000. In Vancouver there was only one failure with estimated liabilities of about \$5,000.

FAILURES BY BRANCHES OF BUSINESS

Trade. - Trading establishments furnished the largest number of failures, 87 assigning in September, 1933, as compared with 75 in August, 1933, and 99 in September, 1932, thus showing a decrease in the latter comparison. Of these concerns, 11 were general stores, 16 grocery, 3 confectionery, 9 fish and meat, 3 dry goods, 8 clothing, 2 books and stationery, 3 automobile, 5 hardware, 2 electric apparatus and 4 coal and wood.

Manufacture. - Manufacturing establishments to the number of 20 assigned in September, 1933, as against 30 in August, 1933, and 38 in September, 1932. The 20 included 4 engaged in the manufacture of vegetable foods, 1 in animal foods, 2 in fur and leather goods, 1 in textiles, 5 in clothing, 2 in non-metallic minerals and 2 in drugs and chemicals.

Agriculture. - Agriculturists assigning in September, 1933, numbered 12 as compared with 5 in August, 1933, and 11 in September, 1932.

Services. - In services, the failures numbered 18 as compared with 20 in August, 1933, and 24 in September, 1932.

Miscellaneous. - There were 6 failures in construction, 1 in transportation and public utilities and 2 in finance.



CUMULATIVE NINE MONTHS' TOTAL OF FAILURES AND LIABILITIES

The cumulative total of commercial failures for the first nine months of 1933 were 1,585, as compared with 1,792, 1,581 and 1,725 for the same periods of 1932, 1931 and 1930 respectively. A considerable decrease is noted when compared with the same period of the previous year. The total failures in trade in the first nine months of 1933 were 840 as compared with 872, 790 and 870 for the same periods of 1932, 1931 and 1930 respectively. In manufacturing, 297 failures in the elapsed period of 1933 may be compared with 350, 343 and 351 in the same periods of the three preceding years. The defaulted liabilities for the first nine months of 1933 were \$26,347,327, as compared with \$30,012,931, \$32,881,623 and \$36,648,414 for the same periods of the three preceding years. Thus defaulted liabilities showed a considerable decrease in the 1933 period as compared with the same periods of any of the three preceding years.






