A considerabie decrease in the number of assignments under the Bankruptcy and Winding Up, Acts, as zeported to the Dominion Iureav of Statistics, was recorded in September 2933, as compared with Soptonier, 2932 , Thile the liabilities of the assignors also showed a decrease. Comeroicl failvos numberod i55, as compared with i93 in the same monch of the peevicus eran, and -50 in dugust: 1933. The estimated liabilities $0: \%$ the assigno: amountinis to $\$ 2,54,568$ as compared with $\$ 2,979,544$ in September, 1932. shoneć a decreasofrhen conpured with $\$ 2.357 .510$ in August, 1933, a sifght decrease is aiso roted.

## COMATMCAI NAITURTS BY AREAS

Marstime provinces. - In the month under reviem, there were 7 assignments in the Maritime Provinces, as corpaired $\pi i$ th 4 in iugust. 1933 , and 9 in September, 1932, a decrease being noted in tho lator comparisoin The liabilities in September, 1933, were about $\$ 26,00 \%$.

Queboc. - Commercial failures in the promince of quebec during September, 1933, numbertc 80 as against 76 in Angist. 1933 , and 90 in September, 1932. A marked decrease is noted in this latter comoriscn. The ifabilities were approximately $\$ 1,360,000$. Of these 80 failures, 3 . with estimatec liabilities of about $\$ 548,000$ occurred in the city of yontrea?。

Cntaッio. - In Ontaric. tho fajiures numisred 45 as against 55 in August, 1933, and 72 in September, ?932, a rery decides decroase being noted in this latter more significant comparison. Liabi-files aggeogated about $\$ 710,000$. In the city of Toronto, there mere \& assignments with jie.ojlities of ebout \$2\%0,000.

Prairie Proyinces. .- In the three Frairie Provinces, fallures increased from 14 in Augusio, 2933 , to 26 in Soptember: $195 j^{\text {a }}$ and may be compared with 21 in September, 1932, a marited decrease being noted in this latter comparison. Liabilities aggregated $\$ 170,000$. There wore 2 failuros rith iicuilities 0i ajout $\$ 12,000$ in the city of Wirnipeg.

British Coiumbis. - In 3ititich Columbia, commercial failures numberod 7 as against 1 in August, i95jo and 9 in Sepuember, 1932. Tie liabilities were $\$ 79,000$. In Vancouver there was only one fainure with ectimated liabilities of about $\$ 5,000$.

## THIUONS ST EOATCFES OT BUSITMSS

Trade. - Trading estabishments fumished the largest number of failures, 87 assigning in Keptember, 1933, as compared with 75 ir sugust, 1933. and 99 in September, 1932, thus showing a decrease in the lattsr comparisom. Of these concerns, 11 were general storas. 16 grocery: 3 confectiongiry, 9 fish and moat, 3 ary goods, 8 clothing, 2 books and stationory, 3 autonobile, 5 baidnsre, 2 olectric apparatus and 4 coal and wood.

Vonufacture. - Manufacturing astabilshmenta to tine number of 20 assigned in September, 29j3. as against 30 in August. 1935 . and 38 in Soptember, 1932. The 20 included 4 engaged in the manufacture of regetable foods, I in animal foods, 2 in fur and leather goods, i in taxtiles. 5 in clotring: 2 in ror-metallic minerals and 2 in drugs and chemicals.

Agriculture. - Agricuiturists assigning in September, 2933, numbered 12 as compared with 5 in August, 193", and In in seouember, ?9j2.

Serrices. - In services, the feilures nuabered i8 as compared with 20 in August, 1933. ard 24 in Soptember. 1932.

Miscellaneous. - There mere 6 fallures in construction, I in transportation and public utilities and 2 in finazce.

## - 2 - <br> CUMULATITE NINE MONTHS' TOTAL OF FAILURES AND LIABILITIES

The cumulative total of commercial failures for the first nine months of 1933 were 1,585 , as compared with 1,792 . 1,581 and 1,725 for the same periods of 1932, 1931 and 1920 respectively. A considerable decrease is noted when compared with the same period of the previous year. The total failures in trade in the first nine months of 1933 were 840 as compared with 872,790 and 870 for the same periods of 1932, 1931 and 1930 respectively. In manufacturing, 297 failures in the elapsed period of 1933 may be compared with 350,343 and 351 in the same periods of the three preceding years. The Iefaulted liabilities for the first nine months of 1933 were $\$ 25,347,327$, as compared with $\$ 30,012,931, \$ 32,881,623$ and $\$ 35,648,414$ for the same periods of the three preceding years. Thus defaulted liabilities showed a considerable decrease in the 1933 period as compared with the same periods of any of the three preceding years.

The assets and liabilities of those failing during September, 1933, are shown by provinces in Table 5, while the ninemonth figures are given in table 6.
