COMMERCIAL FAILURES IN CANADA IN JANUARY, 1934.

The number of assignments under the Bankruptcy and Winding Up Acts, as reported to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics, showed in January, 1934, a substantial decline from the figure for January, 1933, while 11 bilities of the assignors also showed a notable decline. Commercial failures numbered 153 in January, 1934, as compared with 216 in January, 1933, and 159 in December, 1933. The liabilities of the assignors, amounting to \$2,009,188, as compared with \$2,344,772 in December, 1933, showed a decline; when compared with \$4,049,929 in January, 1933, a considerable decline is noted.

COMMERCIAL FAILURES BY ARMAS

Maritime Provinces. In the month under review, there were 6 assignments in the Maritime Provinces, as compared with 11 in December, 1933, and 11 in Jenuary, 1933. A decided decrease is noted in both comparisons. The liabilities of the assignors in January, 1934, were about \$30,000.

Quebec. - Commercial failures in the province of Quebec during January, 1934, numbered 77 as against 82 in December, 1933, and 90 in January, 1933. A decrease is noted in both comparisons. The liabilities were approximately \$1,082,000, of these 77 failures, 41 with liabilities of about \$600,000 took place in the city of Montreal.

Ontario. In Ontario, the failures numbered 49 as against 42 in December, 1933, and 79 in January, 1933. A considerable decrease is hoted in the latter more significant comparison. Liabilities aggregated about \$645,000. In the city of Toronto, there were 8 assignments with liabilities of about \$320,000.

Proirie Provinces. - In the three Prairie Provinces failures decreased from 20 in December, 1933, to 15 in January, 1934, and may be compared with 27 in January, 1933. The liabilities were approximately \$223,000, principally in Alberta. There were 4 failures in the city of Winnipeg with liabilities of about \$16,000.

British Columbia. In British Columbia, commercial failures numbered 6 as compared with 4 in December, 1933, and 9 in January, 1933. The liabilities were approximately \$29,000. Of these 6 failures, 2 with liabilities of about \$12,000 were in the city of Vancouver.

FAILURES BY BRANCHES OF BUSINESS

Trado.- Trading establishments furnished the largest number of failures, 78 assigning in January, 1934, as compared with 84 in December, 1933, and 121 in January, 1933. Of these concerns, 15 were general stores, 9 groceries, 4 confectionery, 6 fish and meat, 7 boots and shoes, 4 dry goods, 5 hardware, 2 jewelry, 2 coal and wood and 1 drugs and chemicals.

Manufactures.— Manufacturing establishments to the number of 22 assigned in January, 1934, as against 31 in Docember, 1933, and 38 in January, 1933. A decided decrease is noted in both comparisons. The 22 included 9 engaged in the manufacture of vogetable foods, 3 in furs and loather, 3 in clothing, 1 in lumber and its manufactured products, and 1 in drugs and chemicals.

Agriculture. Agriculturists assigning in January, 1934, numbered 12 as compared with 9 in Docember, 1933, and 10 in January, 1933.

Services. In services, the failures numbered 20 as compared with 20 in December, 1933, and 22 in January, 1933.

Miscellaneous - There were 7 failures in construction and 1 in finance.

Statistical Tables. The commercial failures in each month from January 1931 are given by provinces in Table 1, while Table 2 furnished statistics of commercial failures by branches of business by months from January 1931 to January 1934. The detailed figures of failures during January 1934 are shown by provinces and branches of business in Table 3. The assets and liabilities of those failing during January 1934 are shown by provinces in Table 4.


