

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COMMERCIAL FAILURES IN CANADA IN NOVEMBER, 1934.

A decrease in the number of assignments under the Bankruptcy and Winding Up Acts, as reported to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics, was recorded in November, 1934, as compared with November, 1933, while the liabilities of the assignors showed a slight increase. Commercial failures numbered 119, as compared with 155 in the same month of the previous year, and 130 in October, 1934. The estimated liabilities of the assignors, amounting to \$2,104,778 as compared with \$1,939,833 in November, 1933, showed a slight increase; when compared with \$2,141,500 in October, 1934, a decrease is observed.

COMMERCIAL FAILURES BY AREAS

Maritime Provinces.- In the month under review, there were 9 assignments in the Maritime Provinces, as compared with 9 in October, 1934, and 7 in November, 1933. The liabilities in November, 1934, were about \$66,000.

Quebec.- Commercial failures in the province of Quebec during November, 1934, numbered 65 as against 71 in October, 1934, and 78 in November, 1933. The estimated liabilities were approximately \$1,128,000. Of these 65 failures, 37 with estimated liabilities of about \$879,000 occurred in the city of Montreal.

Ontario.- In Ontario, the failures numbered 36 as against 35 in October, 1934 and 53 in November, 1933. Liabilities aggregated about \$820,000. In the city of Toronto, there were 12 assignments with liabilities of about \$291,000.

Prairie Provinces.- In the three Prairie Provinces, failures aggregated 7 in November, 1934, as against 7 in October, 1934, and may be compared with 13 in November, 1933. A substantial decrease is noted in the latter more significant comparison. Liabilities aggregated about \$69,000.

British Columbia.- In British Columbia, commercial failures numbered 2 as against 8 in October, 1934, and 4 in November, 1933. A striking decrease is noted in both comparisons. The estimated liabilities were \$21,000.

FAILURES BY BRANCHES OF BUSINESS

Trade.- Trading establishments furnished the largest number of failures, 61 assigning in November, 1934, as compared with 60 in October, 1934, and 85 in November, 1933, thus showing a considerable decrease in the latter comparison.

Manufacture.- Manufacturing establishments to the number of 18 assigned in November, 1934, as against 22 in October, 1934, and 14 in November, 1933. The 18 included 4 engaged in the manufacture of vegetable foods, 2 in pulp and paper, 2 in clothing, 2 in lumber and its manufactured products, 2 in non-ferrous metals and 2 in non-metallic minerals.

Agriculture.- Agriculturists assigning in November, 1934, numbered 7 as compared with 6 in October, 1934, and 9 in November, 1933, thus showing a decrease in the latter comparison.

Services.- In services, the failures numbered 16 as compared with 26 in October, 1934 and 23 in November, 1933. A considerable decrease is noted in both these comparisons.

Miscellaneous.- There were 4 failures in construction, and 1 in finance.

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CUMULATIVE ELEVEN MONTHS' TOTAL OF FAILURES AND LIABILITIES

The cumulative total of commercial failures for the first eleven months of 1934 was 1,408 as compared with 1,885, 2,224 and 2,020 for the same periods of 1933, 1932 and 1931 respectively. A considerable decrease is noted when compared with the same period of the three preceding years. The total failures in trade in the first eleven months of 1934 were 735, as compared with 1,005, 1,069 and 1,001 for the same periods of 1933, 1932 and 1931, respectively. In manufacturing, 203 failures in the elapsed period of 1934 may be compared with 326, 434 and 425 in the same periods of the three preceding years. The defaulted liabilities for the first eleven months of 1934 were \$22,060,739, as compared with \$30,609,086, \$38,849,423 and \$49,595,665 for the same periods of the three preceding years. Thus defaulted liabilities showed a considerable decrease in the 1934 period, as compared with the same periods of any of the three preceding years.


