## COMAGRCIAL FAILURES IN CANIDA IN TEBRUURY, 1934.

The number of assignments under the Bankruptcy and Tinding Up Acts, as reported to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics, showed in February, 1934, a substantial decline from the figure for February, 1933. The liabilities of the assignors also showed a large decline. Comaercial failures numbered 140 in February, 1934, as compared with 214 in February, 1933, and 153 in January, 1934. The liabilities of the assignors, amounting to $\$ 2,039,134$, as compared with $\$ 2,009,188$ in January 1934, showed a slight increase; when compared with $\$ 3,947.202$ in February, 1933, a decline is noted.

## COM: BRCIAL FAILURES BY $\angle R E L S$

Maritime Provinces. - In the month under review, there were 12 assignments in the Maritime Provinces, as compared with E in January, 1934, and 14 in February, 1933. The liabilities of the assignors in February, 1934, were about $\$ 132,000$.

Quebec.- Cormercial failures in the Province of Quebec during February, 1934, numbered 71 as against 77 in Janury, 1934 and 85 in February, 1933. A decrease is noted in both comparisons. The liabilities were approximately $\$ 1,163,000$, Of these 71 failures, 40 with liabilities of about $\$ 613,000$ were in the city of Montreal.

Ontario.- In Ontario, the failures numbered 35, as compared with 49 in January, 1934, and 80 in February: 1933. A notable decre se is noted in the latter more significant comparison. The liabilities aggregated about $\$ 343,000$. In the city of Toronto, there were 5 failures with liabilities of about $\$ 152,000$.

Pririe Provinces. - In the three Prairie Provinces, frilures decreased from 15 in Jnnuary, 1934, to 14 in February, 1934, and may be compared with 29 in February, 1933. A decided decrease is noted when compared with the same month of last year. The linbilities totalled $\$ 231,000$. There were 2 foilures in the city of Ninnipeg with linbilities of about \$24,000.

British Columbian- In British Columbin, commercinl foilures numbered 8 as compared with 6 in January, 1934, and 6 in February, 1933. In the city of Vancouver, there were 4 failures with liabilities of about $\$ 94,000$.

## FAILURES BY BRHNCHES OF BUSINESS

Trade - Trading establishments furnished the largest number of failures, 69 assigning in February, 1933, as compared with 78 in January, 1934, and 117 in February, 1933. Of the 69 concerns assigning, 11 were general stores, 13 groceries, 4 confectionery, 5 fish and meat, 4 dry goods, 6 clothing, 2 hardware, and 1 drags and chemicals.

Manufnctures.- Manufncturing establishments to the number of 20 assigned in February, 1934, as compared with 22 in Janurry, 1934, and 37 in February, 1933. The 20 included 8 engaged in the manufacture of vegetable foods. 2 in fur and leather, 3 in clothing and 1 in non-metallic minerals.

Kgriculture. - Agriculturists assigning in February, 1934, numbered 9, as compared with 12 in Janurry, 1934, and 11 in Februery, 1933. A decrease is noted in both comparisons.

Servicese- In services the foilures numbered 17 as compared with 20 in Jonuary, 1934, and 23 in Februnry, 1933. \& considernble decrease is noted in this latter more significant comparison.

Miscellineous.- There were 6 failures in construction, 4 in transportation and public utilities, and 3 in finnnce.

## CUMULATIVE TNO MONTHS' TORI工 OF FAILURES AND LIABILITIEE

The cumulative totnl of commercirl failuros for the first tro months of 1934 was 293, as compared with 428, 459 and 428 for the same periods of 1933, 1932 and 1931, respectively. The total failures in trade in the first two months of 1934 were 147, as compered with 236, 225 and 212 for the same periods of 1933, 1932 and 1931. In manufactures, 42 failures in the elapsed period of 1934 may be compared with 75 , 92 and 84 in the same periods of the three preceding years. The defoulted liabilities for the first two months of 1934 were $\$ 4,048,322$ as compared with $\$ 7,997,131, \$ 7,811,371$ and $\$ 8,760,380$ for the same periods of 1933. 1932 and 1931, showing a satisfactory reduction in all comparisons.

Statistical Tables.- The commercial failures in each month from January, 1931 are given by provinces in Table 1, while Table 2 furnishes statistics of cormercial failures by branches of business by months from Jonurry, 1931 to Febminry, 1934. The detailed figures of failures during February, 1934, are shown by provinces and branches of business in Trable 3 and the two months' totrl of feilures is show in table 4. The assets and linbilities of those failing during February, 1934, are shown by provinces in Table 5.
