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COMMERCIAL FAILURES IN CANADA IN SEPTEMBER, 1934.

A very decided decrease in the number of assignments under the Bankruptcy and Winding Up Acts, as reported to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics, was recorded in September, 1934, as compared with September, 1933, while the liabilities of the assignors also showed a pronounced decrease. Commercial failures numbered 113, as compared with 155 in the same month of the previous year, and 103 in August, 1934. The estimated liabilities of the assignors, amounting to \$1,628,426 as compared with \$2,344,568 in September, 1933, showed a marked decrease; when compared with \$1,360,691 in August, 1934, a large decrease is again observed.

COMMERCIAL FAILURES BY AREAS

Maritime Provinces.-- In the month under review, there were 2 assignments in the Maritime Provinces, as compared with 5 in August, 1934, and 7 in September, 1933. The liabilities in September, 1934, were about \$64,000.

Quebec.-- Commercial failures in the provinces of Quebec during September, 1934, numbered 60 as against 53 in August, 1934, and 80 in September, 1933. A substantial decrease is noted in the latter more significant comparison. The estimated liabilities were approximately \$944,000. Of these 60 failures, 24 with estimated liabilities of about \$546,000 occurred in the city of Montreal.

Ontario.-- In Ontario, the failures numbered 38 as against 32 in August, 1934, and 45 in September, 1933. Liabilities aggregated about \$491,000. In the city of Toronto, there were 8 assignments with liabilities of about \$98,000.

Prairie Provinces.-- In the three Prairie Provinces, failures increased from 9 in August, 1934, to 11 in September, 1934, and may be compared with 16 in September, 1933, a decrease being observed in the latter comparison. Liabilities aggregated about \$94,000. In the city of Winnipeg, there were 5 failures with liabilities of about \$33,000.

British Columbia.-- In British Columbia, commercial failures numbered 2 as against 4 in August, 1934, and 7 in September, 1933. The estimated liabilities were \$34,666.

FAILURES BY BRANCHES OF BUSINESS

Trade.-- Trading establishments furnished the largest number of failures 54 assigning in September, 1934, as compared with 55 in August, 1934, and 87 in September, 1933, thus showing a considerable decrease in the latter comparison.

Manufacture.-- Manufacturing establishments to the number of 20 assigned in September, 1934, as against 12 in August, 1934, and 20 in September, 1933. The 20 included 6 engaged in the manufacture of vegetable foods, 3 in fur and leather, 3 in clothing, 1 in iron and steel and 1 in non-ferrous metals.

Agriculture.-- Agriculturists assigning in September, 1934, numbered 4 as compared with 4 in August, 1934, and 12 in September, 1933. A striking decrease is noted in this latter comparison.

Services.-- In Services, the failures numbered 18 as compared with 19 in August, 1933, and 18 in September, 1933.

Miscellaneous.-- There were 4 failures in construction, 4 in transportation and public utilities and 1 in finance.

CUMULATIVE NINE MONTHS' TOTAL OF FAILURES AND LIABILITIES

The cumulative total of commercial failures for the first nine months of 1934 was 1,159, as compared with 1,585, 1,792 and 1,581 for the same periods of 1933, 1932 and 1931, respectively. A considerable decrease is observed as compared with the same periods of the previous years. The total failures in trade in the first nine months of 1934 were 614 as compared with 840, 372 and 790 for the same periods of 1933, 1932 and 1931 respectively. In manufacturing, 163 failures in the elapsed period of 1934 may be compared with 297, 350 and 343 in the same periods of the three preceding years. The defaulted liabilities for the first nine months of 1934 were \$17,814,481, as compared with \$26,647,327, \$30,012,931 and \$32,881,623 in the same periods of the three preceding years. Thus defaulted liabilities showed a marked decrease as compared with the same periods of 1933, 1932 and 1931.






