

## COMARCIAL FAILURES BY AREAS

Maritime Provinces.- In the ronth under review, there were 4 assignments in the Maritime Provinces, as compared with 10 in October, 1935, and 9 in November, 1934. The liabilities in November, 1935, were about $\$ 62,000$.

Quebec.- Commeroial failures in the province of Quobes during November, 2035, numbered 57 as aginst 48 in October 1935, and 65 in November, 1934. The estimated liabilities were approximately $\$ 714,000$, Of these 57 failures, 35 with estimated liabilities of about $\$ 501,000$ occurred in the city of Montreal.

Ontario.- In Ontario, the failures numbered 28 as against 37 in October, 1935, and 36 in November, 1934. Liabilities aggregated about $\$ 577,000$. In the city of Toronto, there were 4 assignments with liabilities of about $\$ 83,000$.

Prairie Provinces. - In the three Prairie Provinces, failures aggregated 16 in November, 1935 , as against 18 in October, 1935, and 7 in November, 1934. Liabilities aggregated about $\$ 78,000$.

British Columbia.. In British Columbia, commeroial failures numbered 2 as against 2 in October; 1935, and 2 in November, 1934. The estimatod liabilities were about $\$ 70,000$.

## FAILURES BY BRANCHES OF BUSINESS

Trade. - Trading establishments furnished the largest numbet of failures, 47 assigning in November, 1935, as compared with 46 in October, 1935, and 60 in November, 1934, thus showing a considerable decrease in the latter comparison.

Manufacture. - Manufacturing establishments to the number of 14 assigned in November, 1935, as compared with 13 in October, 1935, and 18 in November, 1934. The 14 inoluded 2 engaged in the manufacture of vegetable foods, 2 in animal foods, 2 in fur and leather goods, and 2 in clothing.

Agriculture. - Agriculturists assigning in November, 1935, numbered 16, as compared with 23 in October, 1935, and 7 in November, 1934.

Services.- In services, the failures numbered 14 as compared with 20 in October, 1935, and 16 in November, 1934.

Miscellaneous. - There were 7 failures in construction, 1 in transportation and public utilities and 1 in mining.

## CUMUGILED NOE NONRS' TOTAL OF FAILURES AND LIABILITIES

The cumulative total of commercial failures for the first eleven months of 1935 was 1,202 as compared with $1,408,1,885$ and 2, 224ter the snme periods of 1934, 1933 and 1932 respectively. A considerable clecrease is noted when compared with the same period of the three preceding years. The total failures in trade in the first eleven months of 1935 were 546 , as compared with $735,1,005$ and 1,069 for the same periods of 1934, 1933 and 1932, respectively. In manufacturing, 165 failures in the elapsed period of 1935 may be compared with 203, 526 and 434 in the same periods of the three preceding years. The defaulted liabilities for the first eleven months of 1935 were $\$ 16,335,690$, as compared with $\$ 22,060,739, \$ 30,603,086$ and $\$ 38,849,423$ for the same periods of the three preceding years. Thus defaulted liabilities showed a considerable decrease in the 1935 period, as compared with the same periods of any of the three preceding years.
