## COMMERCIAL FAILURES FOR THE FIRST EIEVEN MONTHS OF 1936

The cumulative total of commercial failures for the first eleven months of 1936 was 1,096 as compared with $1,202,1,408$ and 1,885 for the same periods of 1935,1934 and 1933, respectively. A considerable decrease is noted when compared with the same period of the three preceding years. The total failures in trade in the first eleven months of 1936 were 494 , as compared with 546,735 and 1,005 for the same periods of 1935,1934 and 1933, respectively. In manufacturing 168 failures in the elapsed period of 1936 may be compared with 165,203 and 326 in the same periods of the three preceding years. The defaulted liabilities for the first eleven months of 1936 were $\$ 13,974,026$, as compared W1 th $\$ 16,335,690$, $\$ 22,060,739$ and $\$ 30,609,086$ for the same periods of the three preceding years. Thus defaulted liabilities showed a considerablo decrease in the 1936 period, as compared with the same periods of any of the three preceding years.

Statistical Tables.- The comercial failures in each month from January, 1933 to November, 1936 are given by provinces in Table $l_{2}$ and by branches of business in Table 2 . The detailed figures of failures during November, 1936, are shown by provinces and branches of business in Table 3, and the lieven months total of failures is shown by provinces and branches of business in Table 4. The assets and liabilities of those failing during November, 1936, are shown by provinces in Table 5, while the eleven-month
figures are given in Table 6 。

## COMMERCIAL FAILURES IN CAITADA IN NOVEMBER, 1936.

A decline in the number of bamkuptcics. as repaned by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics, was recorded in November, 1936 compared with the same month of the preceding year, while the liabilities of the assignors also showed a decline. Commercial failures numbered 94 , compared with 107 in the same month of the previous year, and 94 in october, 1936. The estimated liabilities of the assignors amounting to $\$ 1,077,641$ compared with $\$ 1,500,749$ in November, 1935, showed an outstanding decline; when compared with $\$ 929,225$ in October, 1936, an increase was recorded. The betterment in business fatalities corres ponds with the marked improvement in other economic factors during recent months.

## COMMERCIAI FAIIURES BY AREAS

Maritime Provinces. - In the month under review, there was 1 assignment in the Maritime Provinces, as compared with 7 in October: 1936, and 4 in November, 1935. A very decided decrease is noted in both comparisons.

Quebec. - Cormercial failures in the province of quebec during November 1936 , numbered 56 as against 43 in October, 1936, and 57 in November, 1935. The estimated liabilities were approximately $\$ 544,000$. Of these 56 failures, 30 with estimated liabilities of about $\$ 261,000$ orcurred in the city of Montreal.

Ontario. - In Ontario, failures numbered 30 as against 24 in October, 1936, and 28 in November, 1935. Liabilities aggregated about $\$ 421,000$. In the city of Toronto, there were 4 failures with estimated liabilities totalling $\$ 15,000$.

Prairie Provinces: - In the three Prairie Provinces, failures decreased from 16 in October, 1936, to 4 in November, 1936, and may be compared with 16 in November, 1935. A decrease of $75 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. is noted in both comparisons. Liabilities aggregated about \$63,000.

British Columbia. .- In British Columbia, commercial failures numbered 3 as against 4 in Ocあober, 1936 and 2 in November, 1935. while liabilities were about $\$ 48,000$.

## FAILURES BY BRATCHES OF BUSINESS

Trade. - Trading establishments furnished the largest number of failures, 44 assigning in November, 1936, as compared with 39 in October, 1936, and 47 in November, 1935. A decrease is shown in the latter more significant comparison.

Manufactures. - Manufacturing establishments to the number of 12 assigned in November, 1936, as against 12 in October, 1936, and 14 in November, 1935. The 12 included 2 engaged in the marufacture of vegetable foods, 2 in fur and leather, 3 in clothing and 2 in lumber and its manufactured products.

Agriculture. - Agriculturists assigning in November, 1936, numbered 8 as compared with 20 in October, 1936 and 16 in November, 1935. A decrease of 50 p.c. is noted in this latter comparison.

Services. - In services, the failures totalled 16 as compared with 15 in October, 1936, and 14 in November, 1935.

Miscellaneous. - There were 4 failures in construction, 1 in logging and 1
in finance.
