## COIMERCIAI FAILURES IIT CANADA IN APRII， 1936 AND IN THE FIRST FOUR 工ONTHS

A noteworthy barometer of business conditions was the betterment in commercial failures in April．The number as compiled by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics was limited to 100 against 107 in the same month of last year．A slight decline was also shown from warch to the lowest point of the first four months．The concerns failing during the first four months of the present year，numbering 438，were less than in any similar period of any year during the period of observation from 1922 to the present．The previous low point of 468 was reached in the same months of last year．Defaulted liabilities amounting in April last to $\$ 1,454,000$ showed a considerable decrease fros $\$ 1,685,000$ in the same months of last year and a slight increase when compared with $\$ 1,402,000$ in Narch 1936.

## COMIFRCIAI FAILURES BY AREAS

Waritime Provinces．－In the month under review，there were 3 assignments in the Maritime Provinces，as compared with 5 in larch，1936，and 7 in April， 1935. A very striking decrease is noted in this latter more significant comparison．The liabilities were about $\$ 55,000$ 。

Ruebec．Commercial fallures in the Province of Quebec during April， 1936，numbered 55，as against 50 in harch，1936，and 40 in April，1935．The liabilitiew were approximatciy $\$ 964$ ：000．Of these 55 failures， 32 with liabilities of about $\$ 547,000$ took place in the city of ciontreal．

Ontario．－In Ontario，the failures numbered 22 as compared with 35 in March，1936，and 35 in April，1935．A notable decrease is noted in thesc comparisons． The liabilities were about $\$ 289,000$ ．In the city of Toronto，there were 3 failures with liabilities of about $\$ 15,000$ ．

Prairie Provinces．－In the three Prairie Provinces，failures increased from 9 in rarch，1936，to 18 in 1 p $=11$ ，1936．and may be compared with 15 in $\Lambda$ pril， 1935．The liabilities totalled $\$ 125: 000$ ．

British Columbia．－In British Columbia，commercial failures numbered 2 as compared with 4 in Jarch， 1936 and 7 in April，1935．The liabilities were about $\$ 21,000$ ．

## FAIUURES BY BRANCHES OF BUSINESS

Trade．－Trading establishments furnished the largest number of failures， 45 assigning in Aprils 1936，as compared with 45 in wirarch， 1936 ，and 45 in April， 1935. Of these concorns 9 were general stores， 8 groceries， 3 fish and meat， 5 clothing， 2 books and stationery， 3 jewelry and 4 coal and wood．

Manufacturese－anufacturing establishments to the number of 11 assigned in April， 1936 as compared with 20 in Sarch，1936，and 23 in April，1935．The 11 included 2 engaged in the manufacture of vegetable foods， 3 in fur and leather goods and 2 in clothing。

Agriculture．－Agriculturi．sts assigning in April，1936，numbered 13 am compared with 11 in iarch，1936，and 10 in April， 1935.

Services－In Services，the failures numbered 15 as compared with 15 in karch，1036，and 14 in April， 1935.

Miscellaneouse ．．There were 4 failures in construction， 1 in trans－ portation and public utilities and 3 in finance．

The cudulative totai of commercial failures for the first four months of 1936 was 438 , as compared with 468.574 and 806 for the same periods of 1935 , 1934 and 1933 respectivel. The total failures in trade in the first four months of 1936, were 197 as compared with 225,298 and 436 , respectivelys for the same periods of the three preceding yoais. In manufactures, 74 failures in the olapsed period of 1936 , may be compared with 67, 80 and 150 , respectively, for the same periods of 1935,1934 and 1933 , respectively. The defaited lisbilities for the first 4 months of 1936 ware $\$ 5,937,262$ as compared with $\$ 5,344,355$ in the same period 0 . 1935 and $\$ 8,215,1.95$ and $\$ 14,410,269$ for the same periods of 1.934 and 1933 respectively.
