## COMTERCIAL FAILURES FOR THE FIRST NINE MONTHS OF 1936

The cumulative total of commercial failures for the first nine months of 1936 was 908 , as compared with 980 for the same period of 1935. A considerable decrease was shown from the same periods of the previous years from 1921 to 1935. The total failures in trade in the first nine months of 1936 were 411 as compared with 453 for the same period of last year. In manufacturing, 144 failures in the elapsed period of 1936 may be compared with 138 for the same period of 1935. The defaulted liabilities for the first nine months of 1936 were $\$ 11,967,160$ as compared with $\$ 12,975,483$ in the same period of the preceding year.

Commercial failures in trade for the first nine months of 1936 were 411 as oompared with 453,614 and 8.10 for the same periods of 1935,1934 and 1933 respectively. In manufactures, there were 144 in 1936, as against 138,163 and 297 for the corresponding periods of the three preceding years. Agricultural failures numbered 89 and may be compared with 112,59 and 68 for the same periods of 1935 , 1934 and 1933. The number of general stores faizing in the first nine months of 1936 wos 61 as compared with 76 for the corresponding period of 1935. Sixty-seven grocery stores failed in the first nine months as against 63 in the same period of 1935 . There were 32 failures in fish and meat stores, 49 in clothing, 13 in jewelry and 15 in coal and wood.

A very deoided dearease in the number of assignments as reported to the

- Dominion Bureau of Statistics, was recorded in September, 1936, as compared with September, 1935, while the liabilities of the assignors, also showed a pronounced deorease. Commercial failures numbered 88 as compared with 87 in August, 2936, and 98
- in the same month of the previous year, a decrease of about 10 p.c. being noted in this latter comparison. The estimated liabilities of the assignors, amounting to \$993,779 as compared with $\$ 1,134,786$ in August, 1936, showed a decrease; when compared with $\$ 1,564,546$ in September, 1935 a considerable decrease is noted.


## CO. MERCIAL FAILURES BY AREAS

Maritime Provinces. - In the month under review, there was 1 assignment in the Maritime Provinces, as compared with 4 in fugust, 1936 and 4 in September, 1935. A very decided decrease is noted in both comparisons.

Quebec. Commercial failures in the Province of Quebec, during September, 1936, numbered $3 \overline{8}$ as against 45 in August, 1936, and 50 in September, 1935. A substantial decrease of $24 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{C}$. Is noted in this latter more significant comparison. The estimated liabilities were approximately $\$ 385,000$.

Ontario. - In Ontario, failures numbered 35 as against 28 in August, 1936, and 33 in september, 1935. A slight increase is noted in this latter comparison. Liabilities aggregated about $\$ 496,000$.

Prairie Provinces. - In the three Prairie Provinces failures increased from 9 In August, 1936 , to 13 in September, 1936 and may be compared with 8 in Septomber, 1935. An increase is noted in this latter comparison. Liabilities aggregated about \$108,000.

British Columbia. - In British Columbia, commercial failures numbered 1 as against 1 in iugust, 1936 and 3 in September, 1935. A decided decrease is noted in this latter comparison. The liabilities were about ${ }_{6} 4,000$.

## FiILURES BY BRiNCHES OF BUSINESS

Trade. - Trading establishments furnished the largest number of failures, 41 assigning in September, 2936, as compared with 43 in iugust, 1936 and 48 in September, 1935, thus showing a decrease in both comparisons.

Manufactures. - Manufacturing establishments to the number of 12 assigned in September, 1936 as ngainst 16 in hugust, 1936 and 11 in September, 1935. The 12 included 2 engaged in the manufacture of vegetablo foods, 2 in clothing, 3 in lumber and its manufactured produots, and 2 in non-metalic minerals.

Agriculture.- Agriculturists assigning in September, 1936, numbered 8 as compared with 10 in iugust, 1936 and 9 in Septomber of last year.

Services. - In services, the failures numbered 14 as compared with 11 in lugust, 1936 and 13 in September, 1935.

Miscellaneous. - There were 6 failures in construotion, 1 in mining and 2 in transportation and public utilities. -..

Statistical Tables - The commercial failures in each month from January, 19es to September, 1936 are given by provinces in Table 1, and by branches of business in Table 2. The detailed figures of failures during July, fugust and September, 1936 are shown by provinces and branches of business in Tables 3, 4 and 5 , and the nine months ${ }^{\prime}$ total of failures is shown by provinces and branches of business in Table 6. The assets and liabilities of those failing during July and August, 1936 are shown in Table 7, and September, 1936 is shown by provinces in Table 8, while the ninemonth figures are given in Table 9.
