COMMERCIAL FAILURES IN THE CALENDAR YEAR 1939.

The total number of commercial failures in Canada for 1939, as reported to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics, under the provisions of the Bankruptcy and Winding Up Acts, was higher at 1,392 as compared with 1,219, 1,126 and 1,198 for 1938, 1937 and 1936 respectively. The defaulted liabilities for 1939 were \$15,098,166 as compared with \$14,017,061 and \$14,303,362 for 1938 and 1937 respectively. Thus defaulted liabilities showed an increase as compared with 1938 and with 1937. Increases in number of failures were registered in all provinces, with the exception of Prince Edward Island.

COMMERCIAL FAILURES BY AREAS FOR 1939

COMPARED WITH 1938 and 1937.

Maritime Provinces. - In the year under review, there were 86 assignments in the Maritime Provinces, as compared with 70 in 1938, and 46 in 1937, an increase being noted in both comparisons. The liabilities, in the year 1939, were decidedly lower at \$942,000 as compared with \$1,128,000 in 1938.

Quebec. - Commercial failures in the Province of Quebec, during 1939, numbered 669 as compared with 588 in 1938 and 623 in 1937. An increase is noted in both comparisons. The liabilities aggregated \$6,673,000, and may be compared with \$6,804,000 in 1938 and \$7,008,000 in 1937. A decrease is noted in both comparisons.

Ontario. - In Ontario, the failures numbered 403 as compared with 391 in 1938 and 335 in 1937. The liabilities in 1939 were about \$4,906,000; when compared with \$4,404,000 in 1938 an increase is noted, while a substantial decrease is shown when compared with \$5,126,000 in 1937.

Prairie Provinces. - In the three Prairie Provinces, the failures in 1939 totalled 178 and may be compared with 143 in 1938 and 82 in 1937. An increase is noted in both comparisons. The liabilities in 1939 aggregated \$1,620,000, and may be compared with \$1,272,000 in 1938 and \$1,018,000 in 1937.

British Columbia. - In British Columbia, commercial failures in 1939 numbered 56 as against 27 in 1938 and 40 in 1937. The liabilities of the assignors were approximately \$957,000, and may be compared with \$410,000 in 1938 and \$815,000 in 1937.

FAILURES BY BRANCHES OF BUSINESS FOR THE CALENDAR YEAR, 1937.

COMPARED WITH PRECEDING YEARS

Commercial failures of trading establishments in 1939 numbered 664 as compared with 667 in 1938 and 584 in 1937. In manufactures, there were 210 failures in 1939 as compared with 200 in 1938 and 182 in 1937. Failures of agriculturists numbered 108 and may be compared with 101 in 1938 and 104 in 1937. More detailed information regarding the classes of business in which failures occurred in 1939 is given in Table 3. A summary of commercial failures in each year, from 1937 to 1939 inclusive, is given by branches of business in Table 2.
