

### COMMERCIAL FAILURES IN CAMADA FOR JANUARY, 1941.

The cumulative total number of commercial failures in Canada, as reported to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics under the provisions of the Bankruptcy and Winding-Up Acts, showed a decrease at 102 as compared with 124 for the corresponding period of 1940; and may also be compared with 104 for the corresponding period of 1939. The defaulted liabilities for January, 1941, were \$206.394 as compared with \$1,360.093 for January, 1940, and may be compared with \$700.701 for December, 1940. A considerable decrease in defaulted liabilities is shown when compared with the same period of last year.

#### COMMERCIAL FAILURES BY AREAS

Maritime Provinces. - In the month under review, there were 4 assignments in the Maritime Provinces as compared with 3 in December, 1940, and 5 in January, 1940. The defaulted liabilities totalled \$18,100.

Quobec. - Commercial failures in the Province of Quobec during January, 1941, numbered 57 as against 56 in December, 1940, and 65 in January, 1940. A considerable decrease is shown in this latter comparison. The liabilities were approximately \$457,000.

Ontario. - In Ontario, the failures numbered 34 as compared with 34 in December, 1940, and 38 in January, 1940. The liabilities were about \$244,000.

Prairie Provinces. - In the three Prairie Provinces, failures increased from 3 in December, 1940, to 6 in January, 1941, and may be compared with 10, in January, 1940. The liabilities totalled \$63,000.

British Columbia. - In British Columbia, commercial failures numbered 1 and may be compared with the same number for December, 1940, and 6 for January, 1940.

#### FAILURES BY BRANCHES OF BUSINESS

Trade. - Trading establishments furnished the largest number of failures, 48 assigning in January, 1941, as compared with 41 in December, 1940, and 62 in January, 1940. A decided decrease is noted in this latter more significant comparison. Of these 48 concerns, 6 were general stores, 9 groceries, 5 fish and meat, 7 clothing and 1 boots and shoes.

Manufactures. - Manufacturing establishments showed the greatest decline in January, 1941. Failures to the number of 13 were reported in January, 1941, as compared with 20 in December, 1940, and 16 in January, 1940. Decreases were noted in both comparisons. The 13 included 4 engaged in the manufacture of vegetable foods, 2 in fur and leather goods, 2 in clothing and 1 in animal foods.

Services. - In commercial services, failures numbered 18 and may be compared with 21 in December, 1940, and 19 in January, 1940; a decrease is noted in both comparisons.

<u>Miscellaneous</u>. - There were 7 failures in construction, 2 in transportation and public utilities and 1 in finance.


