## COMNGRC IAI FAIIURES IN CANADA IN NOVEMBER, 1941.

The total number of commercial failures in November. 1941, as reported to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics, under the provisions of the Bankruptcy and Winding-Up Acts, was 86 , as compared with 71 for October, 1941 , and 99 for November, 1940. The defaulted liabilities for November, 1941, were $\$ 585,562$ as against $\$ 825,982$ for November, 1940, and $\$ 548,892$ for October, 1941 .

## COMMRRCIAL FAILURDS BI AREAS

Maritime Provinces. - In the month under review, there were no commercial failures. Three failures were recorded in October, 1941, and one in November, 1940.

Quebec. - Commercial foilures in the Province of Quebec during November, 1941 , numbered 53 as against 43 in October, 1941, and 54 in November, 1940. The liabilities were approximately \$381,000.

Ontario. - In Ontario, the failures numbered 18 as compared with 21 in October, 1941, and 27 in November, 1940. A decrease is shown in both comparisons. The liabilities were about $\$ 125,000$.

Prairie Provinces, - In the three Prairie Provinces, failures totalled i3 in November, 1941, and may be compared with four in October, 1941, and 11 in November, 1940. The liabilities were approximately $\$ 70,000$.

British Columbia. - In British Columbia, there were two commercial fallures in November, 1941, as compared with no failures in October, 1941, and 6 in November, 1940. A decided decrease is noted when compared with the same period of last year. The liabllities were in the neighborhood of $\$ 10,000$.

## FAILURES BY BRANGHES OF BUSINASS

Trade. - Trading establishments furnished the largest number of failures, 38 assigning in November, 1941, as compared with 32 in October, 1941 , and 50 in November, 1940. A decrease is noted when compared with last year. Of these 33 fallures, six were general stores, nine food stores, four dry goods, six lothing stores, and two boots and shoes.

Manufactures, - Manufacturing establishments to the number of 14 assigned in November, 1941, as compared with 11 in October, 1941, and 10 in November, 1940. The 14 included three engaged in the manufacture of vegetable foods, two in fur and leather goods, three in clothing, and two in non-metallic minerals.

Services. - In commercial services, fallures numbered i7 in November, 1941, as aginst 13 in October, 1941, and 23 in November, 1940.

Miscellaneous. - Thare were six fallures in construction, one in transportation and one in finance.
