## COMGERCIAL FAILURES IN CANADA IN MAY, 1941.

The total number of commercial failures in Canada, In May, 1941, as reported to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics under the provisions of the Bankruptcy and Winding-Up Acts, showed a decrease at 83 as compared with 110 for the same month of 1940 , and 111 for the same month of 1939. The defaulted liabilities for May, 1941, were $\$ 838,653$, as compared with $\$ 924,734$ for May, 1940, and may also be compared with $\$ 1,161,334$ for April. 1941. A decrease in defaulted liabilities is shown in both comparisone.

## COMMERCIAL FAILURES BY AREAS

Maritime Provinces. - In the month under review, there was 1 assignment in the Maritime Provinces, as compared with 3 in April, 1941, and 6 in May, 1940.

Quebec. - Commercial fallures in the Province of Quebec, during May, 1941, numbered 44, as against 57 in April, 1941, and 55 in May, 1940. The liabilities were approximately $\$ 499,000$.

Ontario. - In Ontario, the failures numbered 24 as compared with 21 in April. 1941, and $\overline{31}$ in May, 1940. The liabilities were about $\$ 26^{2}, 000$.

Prairie Provinces. - In the three Prairie Provinces, failures increased from 6 in April to 13 in May, 1941, and may be compared with 16 in May, 1940. The liabilities totalled about $\$ 56,000$.

British Columbia. - In British Columbia, 1 comercial failure was reported, as campared with 7 in April, 1941, and 2 in May, 1940.

## FAILURES BY BRANCHES OF BUSINESS

Trade. - Trading establishments furnished the largest number of failures, 39 assigning in May, 1941, as compared with 45 in April, 1941, and 61 in May, 1940. Of these 39 failures, 8 were grocery stores, 3 fish and meat, 3 boots and shoes, 4 dry goods, and 3 coal and wood.

Manufactures. - Manufacturing establishments failing in May, 1941, numbered 11 as against 10 in ApriI, 1941, and 15 in May, 1940. The 11 included 2 engaged in vogetable foods, 4 in clothing, 3 in fur and loather, and 1 in lumber and its manufactured products.

Services. - In commercial services, failures numbered 18 in May, 1941, and may be compared with I8 in April, 1941, and 13 in May, 1940.

Miscellaneous. - Thore were 6 failures in construction and 2 in finance.
