#### COMMERCIAL FAILURES IN CANADA FOR APRIL, 1942.

The total number of commercial failures in Canada, as reported to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics, showed a decrease at 65 as compared with 94 for the corresponding month of 1941. The standing in April may also be compared with 108 for the same month of 1940. The defaulted liabilities were \$481,020 against \$1,161,334 for the same month last year, and \$625,306 in March, 1942.

#### COMMERCIAL FAILURES BY AREAS

Maritime Provinces. - In the month under review, there were 2 assignments in the Maritime Provinces, as compared with one in March, 1942, and 3 in April, 1941. The liabilities were about \$5,000.

Quebec. - Commercial failures in the Province of Quebec, during April, 1942, numbered 42 as against 39 in March, 1942, and 57 in April, last year, a decline of about 26 p.c. being noted in the latter comparison. The liabilities were approximately \$243,000.

Ontario. - In Ontario, the failures numbered 14 as compared with 19 in March, 1942, and 21 for the same month last year, a decline of about 33 p.c. in the latter comparison. The liabilities were about \$155,000.

Prairie Provinces. - In the three Prairie Provinces failures decreased from 6 in March, 1942, to 5 in April, 1942, and may be compared with 6 in April, 1941. The liabilities totalled \$69,000.

British Columbia. - In British Columbia, 2 commercial failures were reported as aginst 2 in March, and 7 in April, last year. The liabilities were about \$9,000.

#### FAILURES BY BRANCHES OF BUSINESS

Trade. - Trading establishments furnished the largest number of failures, 30 assigning in April, last, as compared with 31 in March, 1942, and 45 in April, 1941. Of the 30 concerns, 5 were general stores, 9 food stores, 2 clothing stores, and 2 books and stationery.

Manufactures. - In manufacturing establishments, failures to the number of 7 were reported in April, 1942, as compared with 11 in March, 1942, and 10 in the same month last year. The 7 included 2 engaged in the manufacture of vegetable foods, 1 in animal foods, and 2 in clothing.

Services. - In commercial services, failures increased from 12 in March, 1942, to 13 in April, 1942, and may be compared with 18 in April, 1941.

Miscellaneous. - There were 7 failures in construction, 1 in mining and 1 in finance.
