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## COMLIRCIAL FALLEES IN CATADA IN OCTOBFF 1925.

A slight docrease in the number of assignments uncer the Bankruptey and inding Up Aets, as reported tio the General Stati stios Branch of the Iominion Bureak of Statistics was experienced in october 1925, while the liabilities of the assignors showed an increase. Commercial failures in Canada in October 1925, numbered li2, as compared With 151 in September and 184 in October 1924 . Whe estimatod liabilities of the assignors amounted to $\mathbf{4} 2,685,195$ in october 1925 , as compared with $\$ 1,528,715$ in Septemter 1925 and $\$ 3,398,531$ in october 1924.

## COMBERCIAL FAILUFFA. BY AFFAS.

3laritime Provinces.- Jn the month under review there were 13 assignments in the liaritime Provinces, as compared with 7 in September 1925 and 14 in 0ctober 1924- a decrease of $7 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. in the latter comparison. The iiabilities in Octob $\begin{aligned} \\ \text { O }\end{aligned}$ mere approximately ※135, OCO.

Quebec.- In Quebec, the failures in October 1925 numbered 49. as against 69:in September 1925 and M9 in October 1924, a decrease of 38 p.c. in the latter comparison. The liabilities in october were in the neightorhood of 834,000 ,

Ontario.- Commercial failures in tio province of ontario numbered 47 , as compared with 54 for september and 60 for october 1924 a decrease of about $8 \mathrm{p} \cdot \mathrm{c}$. in the latter comparison. iiabilities aggregated arout

Prairie Province -- In the three prairie provinces, the failures increasod from 17 in deptember to 22 in 0 otober, and may be compared with 29 for ontober 1924. - a decline of $24 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. in the latter comparison. The liarilities were approximately $\mathbf{\$ 1 6 7 , 0 0 0}$.

British Columbia. - In the Pacific province, commorcial failures numbered ll, as compared with 4 in Settember and 8 in october 1924. The liabilities were abuut illal,000.

## FAILURFS BY BRANCHES OR BUSINESS.

Trade.- Trading establishments, as ordinarily happons, constitutod a majority of the failures, 63 such assigning in october 1925, as compared with 69 for beptember and 104 in Octobor 1924, a doclino of $39 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. in the latter comparison.

Manactures.- Manufacturing establishments to tho number of 36 assigned during October 1925, as against 38 in Septembor 1925, and 35 in octoter 1924, The 36 include 7 engaged in the manufacture of vegetablo focds, 6 in animal foods, 4 in clothing, and 5 in lumber and its manufacturod products.

Agrigalure. Agriculturists assigning 1 n october 1925 number 7 , as compared with 9 in soptember 1925 and 14 in october 1924.

Othor failures in october 1925 included 8 in Earages, $E$ in othor customs and repairs, 4 in personal sorvice and 3 in transportation and public utilitios.

## CUMULATEI TEN $\operatorname{LONHH}{ }^{\circ}$ TOTALS OF BANKPUPTCIFS AID LIABIHIOIES.

Mho cumulatod total of bahkruptolos for tho first ten months of 1925 (Ianuary to october) was 1,655 as compared with 1,901, 2,907 and 3,164 in the correspording periods of 1924, 1923 and 1922. respectively - 1925 showing a substantially lower number of failures than 1924, and a reduction of ovor 40 p.c. from either 1923 or 1922. The showing in respect of defaulted liabilitios kas ovon bettor, the cumulated figures for the first ten months of 1926 being 飞24, 468, 377 , as compared with $441,832,123,647,568,734$ and 50,6 ? 6,554 in the corresponding poriods of 1924, 1923.and 1922 rospoctively. (2able 4), Thus defaulod liabilities aro much lower in the ifrst lomonths of 1925 than in the corresponding period of 1924 , and 1923 and less than half what they wero in 1922.
