## COMMERCAL FATLUTES IN CANADA IN DECEMBER, 1925.

As comonred with December 1924, a considerable decrease in the number of assignments under the Baritruptcy and \#indine Up Acts, as reoorted to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics, was experienced in December 1925, while the liabilities of the assignors 2lso showed a decided decrease. Commerdial failures numbered 177. as comoared mith 199 in the same month of the previous year, and as compared Jith 163 in November 1925, an increase beinf noted in this comparison. The estimated liabilities of the assirnors in December 1925 amounted to $\$ 2,300.162$. This is a decrease from $\$ 2,384,268$ in November 1925 while a still greater decrease was shown in comparison with $\$ 3,285,370$ in the same month of the previous year.

## COMMERCIAL FAILJRES BY AREAS.

Maritime Provirces.- In the month under reviem there vere 20 assignments in the Maritime Provinces, as compared rith 8 in November 1925 and 9 in December 1924. The liabilities in December were approximately $\$ 204,000$.
quebec.- In fuebec, the failures in December 1925 number 63, as against 66 in November 1925 and 77 in Necember 1924, a decrease of $18 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. In the latter comparison. The liabilities in December were in the neighborhood of $\$ 905,000$.

Ontario.- Commercial failutes in the province of Ontario numbered 59, as compared with 53 for November 1925 and 81 for December 1924 - a decrease of 27 p.ci in the latter comparison. Liabilities aggregated about $\$ 882,000$.

Prairle Frovinces. - In the three prairie provinces, the failures decreased from 27 in November 1925 to 26 in December 1925, and may be compred with 30 for December 1924 - decline of 13 p.c. in the latter comparison. The liabilities mere about $\$ 134,000$.

British Columbia.- In the Pacific Province, conmercial failures numbered 9. as compared mith $9 \ldots$ in November 1925 and 2 in Jecember 1924. The liabilities were sbout $\$ 1$ 必, 000 。

## FALUURES BY BRATCHES OF BUSINESS

Trade.- Tradine establishments, constituted a majority of the failures. 83 such asciening in December, 1925, as compred with 74 for November and 112 in December 1924, a decline of 26 p.c. in the latter comparison.

Manufactures.- Monufacturing establishments to the number of 43 assigned Iuring December 1925, as against in November 1925, and 32 in December 1924. The 43 includes 5 encaged in the manufacture of vegetable foods, if in the manufacture of clothine, 6 in lumber and its manufactured products, ${ }^{7}$ in iron and steel and 3 in the manufacture of pulp and paper.

Aericulture.- Aericulturists assiening in December 1925 number 16 as compared with 13 in November 1925, and 22 in Lecember 1924, a decline of 27 D.c. in the latter comparison.

Other failures in December 1925 included 6 in garaees, 5 in oth $r$ customs and reparis, 3 in personal service, 3 in business sorvice, in mining and 2 in construction.
