COMMERCIAL FAILURES IN THE CALENDAR YEAR 1944.

The number of commercial failures receded to a particularly low point in 1944, reflecting the prosperous condition of industrial enterprise. Assignments were less during 1944 than in any other year since the statistics were first collected shortly after the termination of the last war. The total was 218 compared with 314 in the preceding year. The number in 1939, the last peace-time year, was 1,392, more than six times as great as in 1944. The greatest number of business fatalities during the period from the end of the last war was shown in 1922 when failures reached the high total 3,925.

Defaulted liabilities also reached a low point last year. A considerable decline was shown from 1943 and the total was less than in any other year since 1923 when the statistics were just collected. The amount was reduced to \$3,101,435 against \$4,486,247 in the preceding year. The total in 1939 was \$15,089,461, while the maximum in the last twenty-two years was reached in 1923 at \$61,617,527.

Business failures reached a lower level in the last quarter of 1944 than in any other quarter of the year. Assignments were 30 compared with 51 in the third quarter. The failures in the first and second quarters were 76 and 71, respectively. Defaulted liabilities in the last quarter were \$753,572, the total for the whole year having been \$3,101,435.

COMMERCIAL FAILURES BY AREAS FOR 1944

COMPARED WITH 1943 and 1942.

Maritime Provinces. - In the year 1944, there were no assignments in the Maritime Provinces, as compared with three in 1943, and 19 in 1942.

Quebec. - Commercial failures in the Province of Quebec during 1944 numbered 162 as compared with 217 during 1943 and 456 in 1942. The liabilities in 1944 aggregated \$1,940,325 and may be compared with \$1,793,468 in 1943 and \$3,878,701 in 1942.

Ontario. - In Ontario, the failures numbered 36 as against 72 in 1943 and 192 in 1942. The liabilities in 1944 aggregated \$456,479 and may be compared with \$1,853,203 in 1943 and \$1,548,074 in 1942.


Prairie Provinces. - In the three Prairie Provinces, the failures in 1944 aggregated 9 and may be compared with 12 in 1943 and 56 in 1942. The liabilities in 1944 were \$383,755 against \$233,000 in 1943 and \$398,000 in 1942.


British Columbia. - In British Columbia, commercial failures in 1944 numbered 11 as against 10 in 1943 and 14 in 1942. The liabilities of the assignors were about \$320,876 and may be compared with \$563,000 in 1943 and \$88,000 in 1942.

FAILURES BY BRANCHES OF BUSINESS IN THE CALENDAR YEAR, 1944, COMPARED WITH PRECEDING YEARS.

Commercial failures of trading establishments as shown in Table 1, numbered 46 as compared with 105 in 1943 and 342 in 1942. Unusual decreases are recorded in both comparisons. In manufactures, there were 32 failures as compared with 23 in 1943 and 80 in 1942. More detailed information regarding the classes of business in which failures occurred in 1944 and 1943 is given in Tables 1 and 5.
