COMMERCIAL FAILURES IN THE SECOND QUARTER OF 1948

Concerns failing in the second quarter of 1948 rose to 222, a larger number than in the same period of any year since 1941. Despite the sharp increase over the second quarter of 1947, failures were considerably lower than in the same period of pre-war years, comparing with 346 for the second quarter of 1939. Concerns failing showed an increase of about 52 p.c. over the same period of 1947, when the number was 146, and may be compared with 59 and 64 for the years 1946 and 1945 respectively.

Estimated current liabilities for the second quarter of the year aggregated \$3,716,852 compared with \$3,101,753 in the same period of 1947, an increase being noted. This is the highest total for the period under review since the pre-war year, 1939, when liabilities aggregated \$4,189,660.

Comparison With the First Six Months of 1947.

Failures rose appreciably in the first half of 1948, being greater than in the same period of any year since 1941. The 425 failures however, were less than in the first half of the previous years of the period of observation from 1922 to the early part of the second world war. The increase over the first half of 1947 was about 60 p.c., the total for that period having been 266.

During the first six months there were six failures in the Maritime Provinces compared with six last year. In Quebec and Ontario, the number rose from 212 to 323 in the former and from 32 to 67 in the latter. Twelve failures were shown in the Prairie Provinces, compared with six the preceding year, and an increase from 10 to 17 occurred in the Pacific Province.

In trade failures totalled 154, compared with 74 in the same period of last year. Failing manufacturing establishments increased from 77 to 92. Nine failures were reported in the primary industries where nine failures also occurred in the first half of the preceding year. Thirty-seven failures were reported in construction and 16 in transportation.
