## COWBROIAI EAJLUEES IN CAIADA IN NARCH 1926


#### Abstract

As compared with Larch 1925, a decidod doorease in tho number of assignments uncer the Bankruptoy and finding Up Acts, as roportod to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics, was oxperienced in liarch 1926 , While the liabilities of the assignors also showed a decided decrease. Commercial failures numbered 136 , as compared with 196 in the same month of the previous year and 144 in ferruary 192A, a decrease being noted in both comparisons. Tho liabilities of tho assignors, amount1ng to \$1,715,862 as compared with \$3, 946,270 in, Karch 1925 and W, 236,409 in February 1926 , also showed considerable doclines in both comparisobs.


## Commeraial Failures by Areas.

Haritime previnoes.- In the month under review there were 7 assignments in the Faritime provinces, as compared with 8 in Feknuay 1926 and 13 in liarch 1925 - a docrease of $46 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. in the latter comparison. The liabilities in Liarch were approximately \$28,000.

Quebec.- In Quebec, failures in karoh 1926 numbered 54 as against 38 in February 1926 and 67 in March 1925 , a decrease of 19 p.c. as compared with last year. The liabilitios in Larch were In the noightorhood of $\$ 717,000$.

Ontarie.- Commorcial failures in ontario numbered 48 , as oompared with 67 for February and 71 for liaroh 1925 - a decrease of 32 p.c. in the latter comparison. Liabilitios ageregated about \$694,000.

Prairie Proviaces.- In the threo prairic provinces, tho failuros numborod 25 in Ilaroh as comparod with 25 in Fobruary and 40 in Karoh 1925 - a deoline of 38 p.c. as oomparod with the lattar month. The liabilities woro approximatoly $\$ 242,000$.

British Columbia.- In the Pacific Province, commercial failuros numberod 2 , as compared with 6 in February 1926 and 9 in Larch 1926 - a decline of 78 p.0. in the lattor comparison. Tho liabilitios were about $\$ 34,0 C 0$.

## Eailures by Branchos of Business.

Trade.- Trading ostablishmonts constituted as usual a majority of the failures, 64 such assigning in March 1926, as compared with 74 for Pebruary 1926, and 112 in Larch 1925, a deolino of about 43 p.c. in this comparison.

Wanufacturos. Nanufacturing ostablishmonts to tho number of 22 assigncd during Larch, as against 20 in Fobruary 1926 and 31 In Larch 1925 - a decline of 29 p.c. as compared with last year.

Africulturen- Agriculturists assigning in iaroh 1926 numberod 17, as compared with 11 in February 1926 and 18 in Harch 1925.

Other failures in Larch included in constructicn, 2 in transportation, 18 in service and 2 in mining.

Tho cumulative tota: of commercial failures for tho throo months of 1926 was 464 as compared with $630,774,1,110$ ard 1,054 for 1925, 1924, 1923 and 1922 respectively, this teing the best showing for the same period of the last five years. The defaulted liabilities for 1926 were $6,936,058$ as compared $\because i t h, 8,528,251$,亿 $14,333,053,319,674,76 \%$ and $418,492,847$ for $1925,1924,1923$ and 1922 respectirely. Thus defaulted liabilities are less than half what thoy wore in 1924, 1923 and 1922.
