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### COMMERCIAL FAILURES

## UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THE BANKRUPTCY AND WINDING UP ACTS

During the first quarter of 1956, there were 709 failures under the provisions of the Bankruptcy and Winding Up Acts, as compared with 661 bankruptcies during the same period of 1955. Estimated liabilities involved amounted to \$19,071,000, more than 28 per cent above the 1955 first quarter total of \$14,858,000. The average value of liabilities per failure was just below \$26,898, appreciably higher than last year's first quarter average of \$22,479.

Owing to changes in the administration of bankruptcies as introduced by the Bankruptcy Act of 1949, the data since July 1950 are not comparable with preceding periods. In the third part of the Act, provision is made for proposals from insolvent persons. Agreements made under this method are not normally included with the statistics of bankruptcies, but when such proposals are rejected by the creditors or fail in their purpose, the proceedings may then come under the Bankruptcy Act. In Table 6 of this report, the number of proposals is shown so as to give a general impression of the trend.

### Failures by Industries

The number of bankruptcies in the trade sector, where a high proportion of business mortalities usually occurs, dropped substantially from 253 in the first quarter of 1955 to 201. Failures in the general store, clothing, fish and meat and electrical apparatus fields all fell off in this comparison. Bankruptcies of manufacturing establishments declined to 60, just over half the total of 117 for the first quarter of the previous year. Service insolvencies, on the other hand, rose from 114 in the first three months of 1955 to 139. Failures in the construction sector advanced from 44 in the first quarter last year to 119.

#### Failures by Economic Areas

The number of bankruptcies in Quebec rose from 475 to 522 in the first quarter comparison and failures in Ontario advanced from 122 in the first quarter of 1955 to 145 in the same period of 1956. Insolvencies in the Prairie region, however, dropped from 35 in the first quarter last year to 20, while British Columbia bankruptcies declined from 20 to 14 in the same comparison. In the Atlantic Provinces, there were 8 failures in the first three months of 1956, as compared with 9 for the same period last year.

Insolvency

It must be emphasized that insolvencies can occur through other means than the Bank-ruptcy and Winding Up Acts. Relevant legislation includes the Farmers' Creditors' Arrangement Act, the Companies' Creditors' Arrangement Act and various provincial Bulk Sales Acts. Statistics in this report relate to the Bankruptcy and Winding Up Acts only.
