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## CCMMERCIAL FAILURES IN CANADA IN SEPTEMBER 1927

As compared with Scptomber 1926, the number of assignments under the Bankruptcy and Winding Up Actse.. as reported to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics, show a slight decrease, while the liabilities of the assignors show an increase. Commorcial failures in Canada in Septembor, 1927, numbered 126 as compared ith 132 for the same month of the previous year and 147 in August 1927. The liabilitics of the assignors amounted to $\$ 2,845,749$ as compared with $\$ 2,497,610$ in Septomber 1926 and $\$ 2,371,788$ in August, 1927.

## COMMRCI AL FAILURES BY AREAS

Maritime Provinces.- In the month under revien there were 6 assigrments in the Maritime Provinces, as compared mith 24 in August of the, same year and 11 in Soptember of the previous year, a decrease of about 45 per cent. in this comparison. The liabilities in Soptember mere approximately $\$ 32,000$.

Quebec. - In Quebec, failures in September were 43 as compared with 55 in August 1927, and 44 in September 1926. The liabilities were in the neighborhood of $\$ 997,000$.

Ontario.- Commercial failyres in Ontario mumbered 51 as compared with 46 in August 1927, and 47 in September of the previous year, an increase of about 9 per cent. in the latter comparison. The liabilities were about $\$ 1,302,000$.

Prairic Provinces.- In the three prairic provinces, the commercial failures numbered 21 in September 1927, as compared nith 13 in August 1927 and 25 in September 1926, a decrease of 16 per cent. in this comparison. The liabilities yere about $\$ 424,000$.

British Columbia.- In the Pacific Province, the commercial failures numbered 5 as compared with 9 for the previous month of the same year, and 5 for Suptombor 1926. The liabilities totalled \$91,000.

## FAILURES BY BRANCHES OF BUSINESS

Trade.- Trading esteblishments constituted as usual a majority of the failures, 59 assigning in September 1927 as compared with 59 in August of the same year and 48 in September 1926.

Manufactures.- Manufacturing establishments to the mamber of 29 assigned during September, 1927, as against 37 in August 1927 and 25 in September 1926.

Other failures rumbered 5 in agriculture, 4 in construction, 3 in loggingfishing and trapning, 2 in mining and 17 in service.

## GUMLATIVE IIGHT MONTHS TOTAL OF FAIIURヨS AND ITABILITES

The cumulative total of commercial failures for the first nine months of 1927 was 1,280 was compared $\because$ ith $1,23,1,513,1,717,2,707$ and 2,800 for the same periods of $1926,1925,1924,1923$ and 1922 respectivcly. The defaulted liabilities for the first nine months of 1927 were $\$ 21,632,043$ as compared with $\$ 21,119,370, \$ 21,783,1$ ô2 $\$ 38,433,592, \$ 45,295,191$ and $\$ 45,538,749$ for the same periods of the five preceding years. Thus defaulted liabilities shoved a slight increase as compared with the same period of 1926 and a decline as compared mith the same poriods of $1925,1924,1923$ and 1922.
