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COMMERCIAL FAILURES<br>Under the Provisions of the Bankruptcy and Winding Up Acts

During the first quarter of 1966 the total number of business failures reconded under the provisions of the Bankruptcy and Winding Up Acts was 821 , a 13.7 per cent decrease from the revised total of 951 insolvencies recorded for the first quarter of 1965 . The estimated total of liabilities of bankrupt firms was $\$ 63,971,000$ as compared with $\$ 58,814,000$ for the same quarter of last year.

## Failures and Liabilities by Industries

The largest number of bankruptcies occurred in the trade sector with 309 failures compared with 413 in the first quarter of 1965. Liabilities were lower in this industry. In the manufacturing industries the number of business fallures was slightly lower and the liabilities increased from $\$ 7,268,000$ to $\$ 9,727,000$ in the first quarter comparison. The number of bankruptcies in the construction industry declined from 186 to 165 , however the liabilities increased from $\$ 11,877,000$ to $\$ 14,684,000$. In the financial sector the number of business failures increased from 22 to 32 and the liabilities from $\$ 9,885,000$ to $\$ 15,556,000$. In the service industry the number of insolvent firms and the liabilities were lower than for the same quarter of 1965.

## Failures and Liabilities by Economic Areas

There were 462 bankruptcies in Quebec during the first quarter of 1966 compared with 503 for the same period of 1965. Estimated liabilities of these fims increased from $\$ 25,262,000$ to $\$ 30,580,000$. In Ontario the number of business fallures decreased from 362 to 292 and the liabilities increased from $\$ 23,333,000$ to $\$ 29,298,000$. In the Prairie Provinces the number of insolvent firms and the liabilities were lower in the 1965-66 comparison. In British Columbia the number of bankrupt firms were lower as was the liabilities.

## Failures by Size of Liabilities

The data presented in Table 4 indicate that the greatest number of fallures involved businesses with liabilities in the $\$ 5,000$ to $\$ 25,000$ size group. Business failures in the $\$ 50,000$ to $\$ 100,000$ range increased slightly and in the $\$ 100,000$ and over group from 97 to 116 in the $1965-66$ comparison.

## Coverage

The statistics of failures in this report are limited to those bankruptcies filed under Federal legislation (the Bankruptcy and Winding Up Acts) and does not include failures, sales or seizures carried out under other legislation. In Table 6 the number of failures of wage earners is shown but the amount of liabilities is not recorded. Proposals from insolvent persons are not included in the bankruptcy data but when such proposals are rejected by the creditors the proceedings may then come under the Bankruptcy Act. In Table 6 the number of proposals is shown to give a general impression of the trend.
