## COMMERCIAL FAILURES IN 1928

The cumulative total of commercial failures for 1928 , as reported to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics under the provisions of the Bankruptcy and winding Up hots, was 2,037 as compared with $1,841,1,773,1,996,2,319,3,408$ and 3,925 for 1927, 1926, 1925, 1924, 1923 and 1922 respectively. The defaulted liabilities for 1928 were $32,455,437$, as compared with $\$ 30,634,469, \$ 32,291,125, \$ 32,153,697$, $\$ 48,105,397, \$ 61,617,527$ and $\$ 63,692,219$ for $1927,1926,1925,1924,1923$ and 1922.

Commercial iailures ir trade in $1920^{\circ}$ were 884 as compared with 818 ir 1927 , 805 in 1926, 1,026 in 1925 and 1,317 ir. 1924. Ir manufactures, there were 505 failures in 1928, as against 430 in 1927, 390 ir, 1926,403 in 1925 and 329 in 1924. Failures of agriculturists showed a decline from 204 in 1924 to 158 in 1925 , 135 in 1926, 116 in 1927, and 108 in 1928. More detailed information regarding the classes of business in which failures occurred in 1928 is given in Table 4 .

## COMAERCIAL FAILURES IN DECEMBER 1928

As compared with Pecember 1927, the number of assignments under the Bankruptey and winding Up Acts, as reported to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics, showed a considerable increase in December 1928, while the liabilities of the assignors also showed a decided increase. Commercial failures in December 1928 numbered 230 , as compared with 176 for the same month of the previous year and 193 in November 1928. The liabilities of the assignors amounted to $\$ 4,178,022$, as compared with $\$ 3,088,127$ in December 1927 and $\$ 3,977,562$ in November 1928.

## Comnercial Failures by Areas

Maritime Provinces.- There were 20 assignments in the inaritime Frovinces, us compared with 7 in November 1928 and 9 in December 1927. The liabilities of the assignors in December 1928 were approximately $\$ 152,000$.

Quebec.- In quebec, failures in December 1928 numbered 105, as compared with 72 in November and 67 in December 1927. The liabilities in Fecember 1928 were in the neighborhood of $\$ 1,387,000$.

Ontario.- Commercial failures in Ontario numbered 79, as compared with 80 in November of the same year and 69 in December 1927. The liabilities in December 1928 were approximately $\$ 1,896,000$.

Prairie Provinces.- In the three Prairie Provinces, the commercial failures totalled 25 in December 1928, as compared with 30 in November 1928 and 26 in December 1927. The liabilities were about $\$ 742,000$.

British Columbia.- In British Columbia there was 1 commercial failure as against 4 in November 1928 and 5 in December 1927.

Failures by Branches of Business

Trade. - Trading establishments furnished as usual the largest number of failures, $\overline{124}$ assigning ir December 1928 as compared with 71 in November 1928 ard 92 in December 1927.

Manufactures.- Nanufacturing establishments to the nomber of 51 assigned during December 1928, as against 55 in November of the sume year and 40 in December 1927.

Agriculture.- Failures in agriculture in December 1928 numberod 9, as against 13 in November 1928 and 9 in December 1927.

Other failures ircluded 7 in construction, 3 in finance and 20 in service.

Statistical Takles.- The commercial failures in fach ronth from January 1924 are giver by provirces in Table l, while Table 2 furnishes statistics of commercial fuilures by branches of business by months from January 1924 to December 1928. The detailed figures of failures during December 1928 are shown by provinces, and branches of business in Table 3. The commercial failures in Canadu by provinces and branchos of business in 1928 are shown in Table 4, and the assets and liabilities of those failing during December 1928 and during the year 1928 are shown by provinces in Table 5.
