## COMM FRCIAL FAILURES IN CATADA IN FEBRUARY, 1928.

A considerable increase in the rumber of assigments under the Bentruptcy and Tindinc Up Acts, as reported to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics, Tas ex erionced in Fobruary 1928, as compared mith Febmary 1927, Willo the liabilitics of the assignors also shomod an increase.Commercial failures nambered 185, as compared mith 143 in the same moith of the previous year, and 197 in Jamary 1928. The liabilities of the assignors, amounting to $\$ 2,378,311$ as comparcd with $\$ 2,811,418$ in Jamuriu 1928, shoted a decrease; whon compared with $\$ 2,087,652$ in February 1927, an increase of 13.9 p.c. is noted.

## COMVRRCIAL FAILURES BY AREAS.

Uaritime Provinces.- In the month under revien thero mere 14 assiemments in the Haritime Provinces, as compared with 17 in January 1928 and 19 in February 1927 - a docrcasc of 26 p.c. being noted in the latter comparison. Tho liabilitios in Fobruary 1928 rrere about $\$ 72,000$.

Qucboc.- Cormercial failures in the province of Queboc durins Fobruary 1928 rumbered 6 , as against 58 in Jamary 1928 and 54 in February 1927 - an increase of 26 p.c. being noted in the latter comparison. The liabilities were apuroximately $\$ 905,000$.

Ontario.- In Ontario the failures mumered 69 as against 82 in Jamury 1928, and 43 in February 1927, a considerable increase over the same month of last year. Iiabilities aggregated about \$1,102,000.

Prairie Provinces.- In the three Prairie Provinces, the failures decreased from 36 in Jamary 1928 to 29 in February 1928 and may be compared with 25 in February 1927 - an increase of 16 p.c. In the latter comparison. The liabilities nere about $\$ 249,000$.

British Columbia. - In the Pacific Province, commercial failures mumered 8 as compared with 4 in Jamuary 1928 and 6 in February 1927. The liabilities were about $\$ 49,000$.

## FAILURES BY BRANCHES OF BUSIMESS.

Trade. - Trading establishments constituted a majority of the failures, 76 assicnins in February 1928, as compared with 83 in Jamary 1928 and 66 in Febmary 1927an increase of 15 p.c. as compared with the same month of last year.

Uamfactures. - Manfacturins establiskments to the number of 47 assigned during February 1928, as against 45 in Jamary 1928 and 32 in February 1927. The 47 include 8 entaged in the mamufacture of vegetable food, 4 in animal foods, 10 in clothing 6 in lumber and its manufactured products and 2 in iron and steel.

Ariculture.- Agriculturists assigning in February 1928 mumbered 5 , as compared with 13 in Jamary 1928 and 10 in February 1927.

Other Failures.- Other failures in February 1928 included 4 in logeing and fishing, 3 in mining, 7 in construction, 4 in transportation and 25 in service.

## CUMULATIVE TTO MOTHS' TOTAL OF FAILURES A:D LIABILITIES.

The cumulative totrl of commercial failures for the first tioo months of 1928 woe 335 as compared with 334,328 and 432 for the same periods of 1927, 1926 and 1925 resyectively. The defaulted liabilities for the first tro months of 1928 nere $\$ 5,108,729$, as compared with $\$ 4,712,944, \$ 5,224,196$ and $\$ 3,981,971$ for the samo veriods of the threc preceding years. Thus defaulted li=hilities showed an increase then compared with the same periods of 1927 and 1925 and a slight decline when compred with the sme period of 1926.
