

#### COMMERCIAL FAILURES IN CANADA IN MARCH, 1928.

As compared with March 1927, the number of assignments under the Bankruptcy and Winding Up Acts, as reported to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics, remain the same, while the liabilities of the assignors show an increase. Commercial failures in Canada in March 1928 numbered 164, as compared with 163 in March 1927, and 188 in February 1928. The liabilities of the assignors, amounting to \$2,193,258, as compared with \$2,378,311 in February 1928, showed a decrease; when compared with \$1,993,679 in March 1927, an increase is noted.

### COMMERCIAL FAILURES BY AREAS.

Maritime Provinces. - In the month under review there were 6 assignments in the Maritime Provinces, as compared with 14 in February 1928 and 11 in March 1927. The liabilities in March 1928 were about \$11,000.

Quebec. - Commercial failures in the province of Quebec during March 1928 numbered 68, as against the same number in February 1928 and 57 in March 1927. The liabilities were approximately \$987,000.

Ontario.- In Ontario, the failures numbered 54 as against 69 in February 1928, and 63 in March 1927, a decrease of about 14 p.c. being noted when compared with the same month of last year. Liabilities aggregated about \$868,000.

Prairie Provinces. In the three Prairie Provinces, commercial failures decreased from 29 in February 1928 to 26 in March 1928 and may be compared with the same number for March 1927. Liabilities totalled \$237,000.

British Columbia. - In the Pacific Province, commercial failures numbered 10 as compared with 8 in February 1928 and 7 in March 1927. The liabilities were about \$91,000.

#### FAILURES BY BRANCHES OF BUSINESS.

<u>Trade.</u> Trading establishments constituted a majority of the failures, 67 assigning in March 1928, as compared with 76 in February 1928, and 74 in March 1927 - a decrease of about 9 p.c. as compared with the same month of last year.

<u>Manufactures.</u> Manufacturing establishments to the number of 43 assigned during March 1928, as against 47 in February 1928 and 29 in March 1927. The 43 include 5 engaged in the manufacture of vegetable food, 5 in animal foods, 5 in fur and leather, 5 in clothing, 5 in lumber and its manufactured products, 3 in iron and steel and 5 in non-ferrous metals.

Agriculture. - Agriculturists assigning in March 1928 numbered 10, as compared with 8 in February 1928 and 10 in March 1927.

Other Tailures - Other failures in March 1928 included 3 in mining, 3 in logging, fishing and trapping, 7 in construction, 3 in transportation and public utilities. and 22 in service.

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## APPENDENT PROVINTE YEAR TO BE

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### CUMULATIVE THREE MONTHS' TOTAL OF FAILURES AND LIABILITIES

The cumulative total of commercial failures for the first three months of 1928 was 549, as compared with 497, 464 and 630 for the same periods of 1927, 1926 and 1925 respectively. The defaulted liabilities for the first three months of 1928 were \$7,382,987, as compared with \$6,706,623, \$6,936,058 and \$8,628,251 for the same periods of the three preceding years. Thus defaulted liabilities showed an increase when compared with the same periods of 1927 and 1926 and a decline when compared with the same period of 1925.



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
