COMMERCIAL FAILURES IN CANADA IN MAY, 1928.

As compared with May 1927, the number of assignments under the Bankruptcy and Winding Up Acts, as reported to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics, shows a considerable increase, while the liabilities of the assignors show a slight increase. Commercial failures in Canada in May 1928 numbered 146, as compared with 127 in May 1927, and 135 in April 1928. The liabilities of the assignors, amounting to \$2,237,821, as compared with \$2,235,675 in May 1927, showed a slight increase; when compared with \$2,269,681 in April 1928, a decrease is indicated.

COMMERCIAL FAILURES BY AREAS.

Maritime Provinces. In the month under review there were 11 assignments in the Maritime Provinces, as compared with 10 in April 1928 and 9 in May 1927, an increase of 22 p.c. in the latter comparison. The liabilities in May were about \$94,000.

Quebec. - Commercial failures in the province of Quebec during May 1928 numbered 49, as against 51 in April 1928 and 39 in May 1927, an increase of 26 p.c. over last year. The liabilities were approximately \$817,000.

Ontario. - In Ontario, the failures numbered 57 as against 43 in April 1928 and 58 in May 1927. Liabilities aggregated about \$1,024,000.

Prairie Provinces. - In the three Prairie Provinces, commercial failures decreased from 25 in April 1928 to 22 in May 1928 and may be compared with 18 in May 1927, an increase of 39 p.c. in the latter comparison. Liabilities aggregated about \$223,000.

British Columbia. - In the Pacific Province, commercial failures totalled 7 as compared with 6 in April 1928, and 3 in May 1927. The liabilities were about \$80,000.


FAILURES BY BRANCHES OF BUSINESS.

Trade.- Trading establishments contributed as usual the largest number of failures, 57 assigning in May 1928, as compared with 66 in April 1928, and 43 in May 1927 - an increase of about 33 p.c. as compared with the same month of last year.

Manufactures. Manufacturing establishments to the number of 40 assigned during May 1928, as against 31 in April 1928 and 38 in May 1927. The 40 include 6 engaged in the manufacture of vegetable foods, 4 in fur and leather, 9 in clothing, and 4 in lumber and its manufactured products.

Agriculture. - Agriculturists assigning in May 1928 numbered 5, as against 9 in April 1928 and 9 in May 1927, a decrease of 44 p.c. in both comparisons.

Other Failures. - Other failures in May 1928 included 4 in construction, 7 in transportation, 18 in service and 3 in logging, fishing and trapping.



CUMULATIVE FOUR MONTHS' TOTAL OF FAILURES AND LIABILITIES

The cumulative total of commercial failures for the first five months of 1928 was 830, as compared with 752, 715 and 952 for the same periods of 1927, 1926 and 1925 respectively. The defaulted liabilities for the first five months of 1928 were \$\frac{1}{2}11,890,490\$, as compared with \$\frac{1}{2}11,920,951\$, \$\frac{1}{2}11,881,922\$ and \$\frac{1}{2}14,665,727\$ for the same periods of the three preceding years. Thus defaulted liabilities showed a decline when compared with the same period of 1927, and an increase when compared with the same periods of 1926 and 1925.





