## COMARCIAL FATLURES IN CANAA IH TANURY 21929

Is compared with January 1928, a very considerable increase in the number of assignments under the Bankruptey and Winding Jp Acts, as reported to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics, was experienced in Januury 1929, while the liabilities of the assignors also showed a very considerable increase. Commercial failures numbered 269 in January 1929, as compared with 197 in the same month of the previous year, and 230 in December 1928, a decided increase being noted in both cases. The liabilities of the assignors, amounting to $\$ 4,110,756$ as compared with $\$ 4,178,022$ in December 1928, showed a slight deciease; when compurei with ${ }^{\$ 2} 2,811,418$ in January 1928 a large increase is noted.

## COMMERCTAL FATLURES BY AREAS

Maritime Provinces:- In the month under review there were 20 assignments in the Maritime Provinces, as compared with the same number for December, 1928, and 17 in January, 1928 - an increase of about $18 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. in the latter comparison. The liabilities in January were about \$132,000.

Guebec. - Commercial failures in the province of Guebec during January 1929, numbered 114, as against 105 in December, 1928 and 58 in January, 1928. The liabilities were approximately $\$ 1,683,000$.

Ontario. - In ontario, the failures numbered 108, as against 79 in December 1928, and 82 in January, 1928. Liabilities ageregated about $\$ 1,880,697$.

Pruirie Provinces. - In the three Prairic Provinces, the failures decreased from 25 in December, 1928 to 23 in Junuary, 1929 , and may be compared with 26 in Junuary, 1928. The liabilities were about $\$ 397,000$.

British Columbiu. - In the Pucific Province, commercial failures numbered 4 as compared with 1 in Ducember, 2928 and 4 in January, 1928. The liabilities were about $\$ 18,000$.

## FAILURES BY BRANCHES OF BUSINESS

Trade. - Trading establishments furnished as usual the largest number of failures, 140 assigning in January, 1929, as compared with 124 in December, 1928, and 83 in January, 1928.

Manufactures. - Manufacturing establishments to the number of 71 assigned during January, 1929, as against 51 in December, 1928 and 45 in January, 1928. The 71 included 7 engaged in the manufacture of vegetable food, 6 in animal foods, 7 in fur and leather, 9 in textiles, 13 in clothing and 5 in lumber and its manufactured products.

Agriculture. - Agriculturists assigning in January, 1929 numbered 6 as compared with 9 in December 1928 and 13 in January 1928.

Other Failures. - Other failures in January 1929 included 10 in construction, 1 in transportation, 1 in finance and 22 in service.

Statistical Tables. - The commercial failures in each month from January 1925, are given by provinces in Tuble 1 , while Table 2 furnishes statistics of commercial failures by branches of business by months from January, 1925 to January, 1949. The detailed ígures of failures during January, 1929, are shown by provinces and branches of business in Table 3. The assets and liabilities of those failing during January, 1929, are shown by provinces in Table 4.
