## GOMERCIAL PAILURES IN CAMADA IN FEBPUARY, 1929

A slight ircrease ir the number of assignments under the Bankruptcy and Jirding Jjp Acts, as reported to the Dominior: Bureau of Statistics, was experienced ir. February 1929, as compared with February 1928, while the liabilities of the assigriors, showed a very great increase. Commercial failures numbered 197 , as comfredwith 188 in the same morth of the previous year, ard 269 ir January 1929. The Iiabilitie dre the assignors mourted to $\$ 5,715,615$ as compared with $44,467,468$ ir. Jaruary 1929; wher compared vith $\$ 2,378,311$ ir. February 1928, a decided increase is also noted.

## GOMERCIAL FAILURES BY AREAS

Maritime Provinces.- In the mcrith under review there were 9 assignments ir. the Maritime Frovinces, as compared with 19 in January 1929 and 14 in February 1928 - a docreass of about $36 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. The liabilities in February 1929 were about 435,000 .

Quebec.- Commercial failures in the Province of Quebec during February 1929 rumberd 80 , as agairst 114 ir January 1929 and 68 in February 1928-an increase of about 19 p.c. being noted in the latter compariscn. The liabilities were upproximately $\$ 1,047,000$. Of these 80 failures in the Province of quebec, 24 took place in linortreal, and the estimated liabilities were about $\$ 305,000$.
nntario. - In Ontario, the fuilures numbered 75 as against 114 in January 1929, and 69 in February 1928, an increase of about $9 \mathrm{p.c.c}$. over the same month of list year. Liabilities aggregated about $\$ 4,299,000$. In the city of Toronto, there were 14 failures with liabilities of about $\$ 3,265,000$. This unusually high figure is iue to the failure of a large brokerage firm of that city with liabilities of some $93,000,000$.

Prairio Provinces. - Ir the three Prairie Frovinces, failures increased ircm 23 in January 1929 to 27 ir. February 1929, ard may be compared with 29 in Petruary 1928 - an increaso of about 7 p.c. In the latter comparison. The liabilities were about $\$ 284,000$. There were five failures in the city of winnipeg with liabilities of about $\$ 27,000$.

British Celumbia. - Ir the Pacific Province, commercial failures numbered 6 as compured with 4 in Junuary 1929 ard 8 in. February 1928. The liabilitios totallec $\$ 50,000$. Of these 6 failures for February 1929, 4 were in the city of Vancouver, With liabilities of about $\$ 35,000$.

## FaILMESE EY BRUNOHES OF BUSIINESS

Trace. - Tradirg estabiishments furnished as usual the largest number of Cullures, 88 assigring in February, 1929, as compared with 140 in Junuury, 1929 and 76 in February, 1928.

Maruactures. - Wanufacturing establishments to number of 57 assigned Suring Ftbruary 1929, as ugainst 71 in Jaruary 1929 ard 47 ir, February 1928. The 57 included 9 ir the marufacture of vegetable focds, 5 ir animal foods, 7 in fur and leather, 4 ir, textiles, 8 in clothing, 4 in lumber ard its manufactured profucts ard 5 ir. ircr ard steel.

Agriculture. - Agriculturists assigring ir February 1929 numbere 11 us comparad with 8 in Jamary 1929 und 13 in February 1928.

Cther Fuilures, - Other failures ir. February 1929 included 4 in corstruction, 4 ir. transportatior ard public utilities, and 1 in firance.

The cumulative total of commercial fallures for the first two months of 1929 was 466 , as compared with $385,334,328$ and 432 for the same periods of 1928, 1927, 1926 and 1925 tespectively. The def aulted liabilities for the first two months of 1929 were $10,183,083$, as comparea with $\$ 5,189,729, \$ 4,712,944, \$ 5,224,196$ and 4 $3.981,971$ for the sume periods of the four preceding years.
