## COMMERCIAL FAILURES IN CANADA IN APRIL, 1929

An increase in the number of assignments under the Bankruptcy and Winding Up Acts, as reported to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics, was experienced in April, 1929, as compared with April, 1928, while the liabilities of the assignors also showed an increase. Commercial failures numbered 174, as compared vith 138 in the same month of the previous year and 180 in March, 1929. The liabilities of the assignors, amounting to $\$ 2,523,033$ as compared with $\$ 2,960,089$ in March, 1929 , showed a decrease; when compared with $\$ 2,269,682$ in April, 1928, an increase is noted.

## COMMERCIAL FAILURES BY AREAS

Maritime Provinces. - In the month under review, there were 13 assignments in the Maritime Frovinces, as compared with 8 in March, 1929, and 10 in April, 1928 an increase being noted in both comparisons. The liabilities in April, 1929, were about $\$ 84,000$.

Quebec.- Commercial failures in the Province of \&uebec during hpril, 1929, numbered 87 , as against 74 in March, 1929, and 54 in April, 1928. The liabilities were approximately $\$ 1,699,211$. Of thes 87 failures in the Province of Quebec, 21 took place in the city of Montreal, where the estimated liabilities were about \$241,000.

Ontario.- In Ontario, the failures numbered 55, as against 69 in March, 1929, and 43 ir April, 1928, an increase of about $28 \mathrm{p.c}$. over the same month of last year. Liabilities aggregated about $\$ 634,000$. In the city of Toronto, there were 6 assignments with liabilities of about $\$ 35,000$.

Prairie Provinces. - In the three Prairie Provinces, failures decreased from 23 in March, 1929 to 16 in April, 1929, and may be compared with 25 in April, 1928. The liabilities totalled $\$ 93,000$. There were 2 failures in the city of Winnipeg with liabilities af about $\$ 12,000$.

British Columbia. - In British Columbia, commercial failures numbered 3 as compared with 6 in March, 1929, and 6 in April, 1928. The liabilities were about \$11,000. Of these 3 failures for April, 1929, 2 were in the city of Vancouver, with liabilities of about $\$ 7,000$.

## FAILURES BY BRANCHES OF BUSINESS

Trade. - Trading establishments furnished as usual the largest number of failures, 83 assigning in April, 1929, as compared with 79 in March, 1929, and 67 in April, 1928. Of these failures in trade, 21 are general stores, 11 grocery stores, 2 confectionery, 4 fish and meat, 4 boots and shoes, 5 dry goods, 10 clothing, 3 hardware, 3 electrical apparatus, 3 coal and wood and 2 in jewellery. The liabilities of those failing in April were about $\$ 748,000$.

Manufactures. - Manufacturing establishments to the number of 40 assigned in ipril, 1929, as against 38 in March, 1929 and 33 in April, 1928. The 40 included 7 engaged in the manufacture of vegetable foods, 5 in fur and leather, 10 in clothing, 5 in lumber and its manufactured products, 2 in manufacture of non-ferrous metals and 2 in the manufacture of non-metallic minerals. The liabilities were in the neighbourhood of $\$ 402,000$.

Agriculture.- Agriculturists assigning in April, 1929, numbered 11, as comparod with 16 in March, 1929 and 9 in April, 1928.

Other Failures.- Other failures in hpril, 1929, included 6 in construction, 3 in transportation and public utilities and 1 in finance.

## CUMULATIVE FOUR MONTHS' TOTAL OF FAILURES AND LIABILITIES

The cumulative total of commercial failures for the first four months of 1929 was 820 , as compared with $687,629,595$ and 792 for the same periods of 1928, 1927, 1926 and 1925 respectively. The total failures in trade for the first four months of 1929 was 390, as compared with 293, 287 and 279 for the same periods of 1928,1927 and 1926; while in manufactures 206 for the first four months of 1929 may be compared with 168, 140 and 114 for the alime periods of the three preceding years. The defaulted liabilities for the first four months of 1929 were $\$ 15,666,205$, as compared with $\$ 9,691,853, \$ 9,092,266$ and $\$ 9,816,537$ for the same periods of the three preceding years. Thus defaulted liabilities showed a considerable increase when compared with the same periode of 1928, 1927 and 1926 respectively.
