COMMRCIAI FAILURES FCR THE TIRST SIX MONTHS OF 1229.
The cumulative total of commercial failures for the first six months of 1929 , as reported to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics under the profisions of the Bankruptcy and Winding Up Acts, was 1,153 as compared wi th 968 , 898 and 864 for the same periods of 1928, 1927 and 1926 respectively. The defaulted liabilities for the first half of 1929 were $\$ 21,025,946$ as compared with $\$ 14,213,748, \$ 14,358,932$ and $\$ 14,194,835$ raspectively for the same periods of the three preceding years. Thus defaulted liabilities show a considerable increase over the seme periods of 1928,1927 and 1926.

Comercial failures in trade for he irst :x months of 1929 were 570 as compared with 404, 401 and 406 for the san: periods. 1928,1927 and 1926 respectively. I2 manufactres, there were 265 in 1929 as a inst 206 and 176 for the corresonding peri ods of the three preceding year Agric; iaral failures increased from 51 in the first half of 1928 :0 69 for the sam veriod od 1929 and may be compared with 62 and 68 for the same perion of 1927 and 19c6. The nuber of general stores failing in the first sif months of 1929, was 105, as compared wi h 59 in the corresponding period 0 1928. Sixty-fiv grocery stores failed in the $f$ st half of 1929, as against 38 for tie same period of $1 y 28$, while 30 fish and meal stoi s ssigned in 1929 and may be compared with 29 in the first half of 1928.


## Commercial Failures in Canada in June, 1929.

An increase in the number of assignments under the Bankruptcy and Winding up Acts, as reported to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics, was experienced in June, 1929, as compared with June, 1928, while the liabilities of the assignors showed an increase. Commercial failures numbered 148, as compared with 133 in the same month of the previous

- year, and 185 in May, 1929. The liabilities of the assignors, amounting to $\$ 2,956,869$ as compared with $\$ 2,402,872$ in May, 1929, showed an increase; when compared with $\$ 2,235,779$ in June, 1928, a considerable increase is noted.

Commercial Failures by Areas.
Maritime Provinces.- In the month under review, there were 6 assigments in the Maritime PTovinces, as compared with 11 in May, 1929 and 12 in June, 1928. The liabilities in June, 1929, were about $\$ 63,000$.

Quebec. - Conmercial failures in the Province of Quebec during June, 1929, numbered 58, as against 82 in May, 1928, and 46 in June, 1928, an increase of about' 26 p.c. in the latter comparison. The liabilities were approximately $\$ 984,000$. Of these 58 failures in the province of quebec, 36 occurred in the city of Montreal, where the estimated lisbilities were about $\$ 683,000$.

Ontario.- In Ontario, the failures numbered 55, as against 70 in May, 1928, and 48 in June, 1928, an increase of about 15 p.c. over the same month of last year. Liabilities aggregated about $\$ 751,000$. In the city of Toronto, there were 20 assignments with liabilities of about $\$ 310,000$.

Prairie Provinces.- In the three Prairie Provinces, failures increased from 18 in May, 1929 to 24 in June, 1929 as compared with 23 in June, 1928. Liabilities were $\$ 348,000$, mainly in Nanitoba. There were 7 failures in the city of Wimipeg, with liabilities of about $\$ 190,000$.

British Columbia, - In British Columbia, commercial failures numbered 5 as compared with 4 in May, 1929 and 4 in June, 1928. The liabilities were about $\$ 811,000$. of these 5 failures, 2 were in the city of Vancouver, with liabilities of about $\$ 18,000$.

## Tailures by Branches of Business.

Trade.- Trading establishments furnished the largest number of failures, 19 assigning in June, 1929, as compared with 101 in May, 1929 and 54 in June, 1928. of these concerns, 10 were general stores, 10 grocery stores, 9 fish and meat, 15 clothing, 4 hardware, and 4 in drugs and chemicals.

Manufactures. - Manuf acturing establishments to the number of 29 assigned in June, 1929, as against 33 in May, 1929, and 32 in June, 1928. The 29 included 5 engaged in the manufacture of vegetable foods, 4 in fur and leather goods, 9 in clothing and 2 in lumber and its manufactured products.

Miscellaneous.- Agriculturists assigning in June, 1929 numbered 8, as compared with 17 in May, 1929, and 6 in June, 1928. Three assignments were reported in construction and 2 in finance.

Statisticel Tables. - The commercial failures in each month from January 1925 are given by provinces in Table 1, while Table 2 furnishes statistics of commercial failures by branches of business by months from January 1925 to June 1929. The detailed figures of failures during June 1929 are shown by provinces and branches of business in Table 3. The assets and liabilities of those failing during June 1929 are shown by provinces in Table 5.
