## COMERCIAL FAILURES IN CANADA IN SEFTLMBER, 1929

Erratum. - The statemert in the August number of this bulletir rolative to the failure of a large lumbering firm in British Columbia has been fourd to be erroneous, and the figures of the present bulletin have been revised accordirty.

A decrease in the number of assignments under the Bankruptcy and "inding $u_{1}$ Acts, as reforted to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics was experienced in September, 1929, as compared with September, 19<8, while the liabilities of the assignors also showed a decrease. Commercial failures numbered 150, as compared with 164 in the same morth of the previous year, and 137 in August, 1929. The liabilities of the assignors, amounting to $\$ 1,710,194$ in September, 1924 as compared with $\psi 1,743,576$ in August, 1929 , showed a decrease; when compared with $42,070,279$ in September, 1928, a considerable decrease is noted.

## COMDERCIAT FAILURSS EY REAS

MARITINE PRCVIICES. - In the month urier review, thero were 5 assigamants in the Maritime Frovinces, as compared with 6 in sugust, 1929 and 16 in September, 1928. Tine ilabilitiss in September, 1929, were about i12,000.

QUesc. - Commercial iailures in the Frovince of i,uebec duri ng Septerber, 1929, rumbersi 66, as aguinst 48 in August, 1929, and 66 in September, 1920. The liduilities were approximately $\$ 812,000$. Of these 66 failuses in the Frovirce of quabec, 18 occurred in the city of Montrol, whero the ost imated liabilities were ubout $\$ 236,000$.

ONTAKIO. - In Ontario, the iailures numbered 56, as against 46 ir August, 1929 and 67 in the same month of the previous year, a decrease of about $16 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. in the latter comparison. Liabilities aggregated about $\$ 640,000$. In the city of Toronto there were 17 assignments with liabilities of about $\$ 203,000$.

FRAIRTE PKOVINCES. - In the three Frairie Provinces, failures decreased fror 29 in August, 1924 to 18 in September, 1929, us compared with 17 in September, 1928. Liabilities vers abcut $\$ 189,000$. There was I failure in the city of wimipeg, with liabilities of about $\% 4,000$.

BAITIGH COLUMBIA. - In Eritish Columbia, commercial failures numbered 5 us compared with in hugust, 1949 ind 3 in September, 1928. The liabilities were about \$58,000. Of these 5 failures, 3 were in the city of Vancouver, wi th liabilities of abulit $\$ 48,000$.

## FhILURES BY BRANCHES OF EUSIN:SS

FPADE. - Trading stablisiments furnished the largest rumber of failures, 72 assigring in September, $19<9$, as compared with 65 in August, $19<9$ and 79 ir September, 1928. Of these concerns 15 were general stores, 9 grocery stores, 6 bocts and shoes, 6 dry goods, 8 clotning, 3 hardware and 2 coal and wood.

MANFACTURES. - Wanufacturing establishmerts to the number of 25 assigred in September, $19<9$, as ainst 27 in August, 1929, ard 36 in the same month of the previcus year. The 25 ircludsd 4 rgaged in the manufacture of vegetable foods, 2 in drink ard toburco, 6 in clotring, 3 ir, lumber ard its manufactured producta and 2 in the manufacture of nor-ferrous metals.

BIS CLTMEOUS. - sigriouiturists assigning ir, Septeriber, 1929, numbered 8, us compurs with 6 is August, 1929, ard 12 in September, 1928, a decrease of 33 p.c. in the latter comparison. Six assignments were reported ir construction.

The cumulitive totrl of commercial fallutes for the first nine months of 1929 was 1,589 , as compared with $1,414,1,294$ and 1,257 for the same periods of 1928 , 1927 and 1926 respectively. The total failures in trade in the first nine months of 1929 v:ere 790, as comparea with 601,571 and 567 for the same periods of 1928 , 1927 and 1926. Ir marufactures, 346 failures in the elapsed pericd of 1929 nay be compared with 352,298 and 266 in the seme periods of the three praceding years. The defaulted liabilities for the first nine months of 1929 were $\$ 26,618,648$, as compared with $\$ 20,756,502,420,865,970$ and $621,119,370$ for the sume periods of the three preceding years, thus showing \& considerable increase.
