## COMERCIAL FAILURES IN CANADA IN JANUARY, 1930

As compared with January, 1929, a slight decrease in the number of assignments under the Bankruptcy and Winding Up Acts, as rejorted to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics, was experienced in January, 1930, while the liabilities of the assignors showed a very considerable increase. Commercial iailures numbered 261 in January, 1930, as compared with 269 in the same month of the revious year, and 224 in December, 1929. The liabilities of the assignors, a mounting to $\$ 8,661,100$ as compared with $\$ 3,660,224$ in December, 1929, showed a large incraase; when compared with $\$ 4,110,756$ in January, 1929, a considerable increase is again noted. The extraordinarily high figure for liabilities was due to the failure of a large brokerage firm, with liabilities in excess of $\$ 5,000,000$, in Ontario.

## Commercial Failures by hreas

Waritime Provinces. - In the month under review, there were 20 assignments in the Maritime Provinces, the same number as in both December, $19<9$ and January, 1929. The liabilities in January were about $\$ 132,000$.

Quebec.- Commercial failures in the Province of quebec during January, 1930, numbered 120, as against $9<$ in December, 19.9, and 114 in January, 1929. The liabilities were approximately $\$ 1,055,000$. Of these $1<0$ failures, 55 with liabilities of about $\$ 548,000$ took place in the city of hiontreal.

Ontario. - In Ontario, the failures numbered 81, as against 74 in December, 1929, and 108 in January, 1929 , a decrease of $25 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. in the latter more significant comparison. Liabilities aggregated about $\$ 7,042,000$. In the city of Toronto, there were 24 assignments with liabilities reaching the high figure of about $\$ 6,142,000$, owing to the failure of a large brokerage house. In this case, the trustee's statement of affairs indicates a substantial surplus of assets over liabilities.

Priarie Provinces.- In the three Prairie Provinces, failures increased from 29 in December, 1929, to 32 in January, 1930, and may be compared vith 43 in January, 1929, an increase oi about 13 r.c. in this comparison. The liabilities were approximately $\$ 285,000$, mainly in Saskatchewan. There were 5 failures in the city of Winnipeg, With liabilities of about $\$ 27,000$.

British Columbia. - In Eritish Colunbia, commercial failures numbered 8 as compared with 9 in December, 1929, and 4 in January, 1929. The liabilities were approximately $\$ 148,000$. Of these 8 Cailures, 5 with liabilities of about $\$ 134,0 c 0$ wore in the city of Vancouver.

## Pailures by Branches of Business

Trade. - Trading establishments furnished the largest number oi failures, 135 assigning in January, 1930, as compared with 124 in December, 1929, and 140 in January, 1929. Of these concerns, 11 were general stores, 17 grocery, 9 confectionery, 9 fish and meat, 6 boots and shoes, 11 dry goods, 24 clothing, 5 jewelry, 4 coal and wood and 5 drugs and chemicals.

Mianufactures.- Manufacturin January, 1930, as against 43 in December, 1929, and 71 in January, 19<9, a decrease of about $18 \mathrm{~F} . \mathrm{C}$. in the latter comparison. The 58 included 7 engaged in the manufacture of vegetable foods, 2 in animal foods, 8 in fur and leather, 17 in clothing and 9 in lumber and its manuf actured products.

Agriculture. - Agriculturists assigning in January, 1930 numbered 6 as compared with 10 in December, 1929 and 6 in January, $19<9$.

Miscellaneous. - There vere 2 failures in mining, 1 in fishing and 3 in construction.

Statistical Tables. - The commercial failures in each. month from January 1925 , are given by provinces in Table 1 , while Table 2 furnishes statistics of commercial failures by branches of business by months from January, 1925 to January, 1930. The dotailed figures of failures during January, 1930, are shown by provinces and branches of business in Table 3. The assets and liabilities of those failing during Junuary, 1930 , are shown by provinces in Table 4 .
