## COMMERCIAL FAILURES IN CANADA IN UCTOBER, 1930.

A considerable increase in the number of assignments under the Bankruptcy and Winding Up Acts, as reported to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics, was experienced in October. 2930 , as compared with Octobor, 1929, while the liabilities of the assignors also showed a. considerable increase. Commercial failures numbered 216 as compared wit: 176 in the same month of the previous year, and with 192 in September, 1930. The liabilities of the assignors, amounting to $\$ 4,017,101$ in october, 1930, showed a considerable increase when compared with $\$ 2,081,447$ in September, 1930. Whem corpared with $\$ 2,050,232$ in October, 1929, a considerable increase is also noted.

liaritime provinces. - In the month under review, there were 5 assignments in the Naritime Provinces, as compared with 5 in September, 1930, ad 13 in October, 1929. The liabilitics in October, 1930, vere about $\$ 104,000$.

Quebec. - Commercial failures in the Province of Quebce during October, 1950, numbered 93 as against 68 in September, 1930 , and 82 in october, 1929. The liabilities were approximately $\$ 2,029,000$. In the city of Montrexl, there were 45 failures vith liabilities of about $\$ 7,532,000$.

Ontario.- In Ontario, the failures numbered 57, as against 68 in September, 1030 1930, and 54 in October, 1929. Liavilities aggregated about $\$ 1,018,000$. Of these 5 ? failures, 20 with liabilitics of about 4545,000 took place in the city of Foronto.

Prairie Provinces. - In the three Drairie Provinces, failures increased from 26 in September, 1930, to 46 in Ocuober, 1930 , and may be compared with 23 in Octros $r$, 1929. The liabilities were approximately $\$ 469$, 000, principally in Manitoba. There ware 5 failures in the city of Winnipeg with liabilities uf about $\$ 152,000$.

British Columbia.- In British Columbia. commercial failures numbered 11 as ccm.. pared with 7 in September, 1930, and 4 in October, 1929. The liabilities were approximately $\$ 398,000$.

## FATLUFES BY BRANCHES CF EUSINLSS

Trade. - Trading establishments furnished the largest number of failures, 107 assigning in October, 1930, as compared with 93 in notober, 1929, and 97 in September, 1930. of these conceras, 20 were beneral. stores, 18 grocery, 6 cmfectionery, 6 fish and meat, 6 dry goods, 12 clothing, 6 automobile, 7 hardware, 3 jewelry, and 5 arugs an and chemicals.

Manufoctures.- Nanufacturing establishments to the number of 44 assigned in Vctober, $\overline{930}$, as against 40 in September, 1930, and 21 in October, 1929. Ine 44 included 7 engaged in the manufacture of vegetable foods, 4 in animal toods, 5 in fur and leather, 8 in clothing, 4 in lumber and its mamufactured products, 2 in nonforrous metals, and 4 in the manufacture of ron-metallic minerals.

Agriculture. - Agriculturists assigning in October, 1930, numbered 10, as corm pared with 8 in September, 7930 , and 19 in Oc oler, 1930.
iviscellaneous. - There were 6 failures in const wotion, 6 in transportation and public atilities, ard ${ }^{2}$ in finance.

## CUndLaitve ten mont:s toral of failurbs and liabilities

The cumulative total of commercial failures for the first ten months of 1930 was 1,941 , as compared with $1,766,1,614$ and 1,478 for the same periods of 1929,1928 nd 2927, respectively. The failures in trade in the first ten months of 1930 were 977 , s compared with 883,699 and 653 for the same periods of 1929,1928 and 1927. In manufactures, 395 failures in the elapsed period of 1930 may be compared with 367, 399 and 343 in the same periods of the three preceding years. The defaulted liabilities for the first 10 months of 1030 were $\$ 40,565,515$ as compared with $\$ 32,391,423,423,974,412$ and $\$ 24,735$, 094 for the same periods of the three preceding years, thus showing a very considerable increase in the period under review.
