COMEACIML FAILURES IN CAMADA IN NOVEVEEF, 1930

A considerable increase in the number of assignments under the Bankruptcy and Winding Up Acts, as reported to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics, was experienced in November, 1930, as compared with November, 1929, while the liabilities of the assignors also showed a considerable increase. Commercial failures numbered $2 \angle 2$ as compared with 176 in the same month of the previous yeur, and with 216 in Octoour, 1930. The liabilities of the assignors, mounting to $\$ 3,495,951$ in November, 1930 , showed a considerable decrease when compared with $\$ 4,017,101$ in October, 1930. When compared with $\$, 774,707$ in November, 1929, a considerable increase is noted.

## COMAERCIAL FAILURES EY AREAS

Maritime Provinces.- In the month under review, there were 6 assigments in the Maritime Provinces, as compared with 9 in October, 1930, and 17 in Novembur, 1929. The liabilities in Novamber, 1930, were about $\$ 24,000$.

Quebec. - Commercial failures in tue province of Quebec during November, 1930, numbered 86, as against 93 in October, 1930, and 68 in November, 1929. The liabilities were approximately \$1,060,000. In tife city of Montreal, there were 32 failures with liabilities of about $\$ 300,000$.

Ontario.- In Ontario, the failures numburcd 65, as against 57 in October, 1930, und 49 in November, 1929. Liabilities ageregated about $\$ 1,099,000$. Of these 65 failures, 18 with liabilities of ahout $\$ 455,000$ took place in the city of Toronto.

Prairie Provinces. - In the three Prairie Provinces, failures increased from 46 in October, 1930, to 55 in November, 1930, and may be compured with 30 in November, 1929. The liabilities were approximately $\$ 727,000$. In the city of innipeg there were 8 failures with liabilities in the neighbourhood of $\$ 81,000$.

British Columbia.- In British Columbiā, commercilil iailures numbere io as compared witk. Il in October, 1930, and lc in Novonber, 19 29 . The liabilities were approximately $\$ 378,000$. There were 3 failures in the city of Vancouver, with iiabilities of about $\$ 19,000$.

## FaILURES BY BRhNCHES OF EUSINESS

Trade. - Trading establishments iurnished the largest number of failures, 101 assigning in November, 1930, as compared with 93 in November, 19<9, and 107 in October, 1930. Of these concorns, 22 were genaral stores, 9 grocery, 6 coniectionery, 2 drink and tobacco, 4 fish and meat, 8 boots and shoes, 4 dry goods, 5 furniture, 3 automobile, 3 herdware, 4 jewelry, 2 coal and wood and $<d r u g s$ and chemicals.

Manufactures. - Manufacturing establishments to the number of 46 assignod in November, 1930, as against 44 in October, 1930, and 33 in November, 19<9. The 46 included 7 engaged in the manuacture of vegotable foods, 3 in animal foods, 5 in fur and leather, 5 in textiles, 3 in clothing, 8 in lumber and its manufactured products, $\angle$ in non-ferrous metals and $\angle$ in non-metallic minerals.

Agriculture.- Agriculturists assigning in November, 1930, numbored 14 as compared with 10 in October, 1930, and 8 in Novembur, 19<9.

Miscellancous. - There wero 6 failuros in construction, 7 in transportation, 2 in finance and 1 in mining.

## CUMULATIV ELEVEN ONTHS' TOTAL OR PAILURES AND LIAEILITES

The cumulative total of commercial failures for the iirst oleven months of 1930 was 2,163 , as compared with $1,943,1,007$ and 1,665 for the same periods of $19<9$, $19<8$ end 1927 respectively. The failures in irade in the first eleven months of 1930 were 1,078 us compared with 977,760 and $7<6$ for the same periods of $19<9$, 19,8 iard 1927. In manufactures, 441 failures in the elapsed period of 1930 may be compared with 400,454 and 390 in the sume periods of the three preceding years. The defaulted liabilitius for the iirst 11 months of 1930 vere $\$ 43,861,466$ as compared with $\$ 35,166,130$, $\$ 7,183,163$ and $\$<7,991,5<7$, for the same puriods of the three preceding yoars, thus showing a vury considerable increasc in the period under review.
