COMMERCIAL FAILURES IN CAMADA IN MAY, 1930

As compared with May, 1929, a considerable decrease in the number of assignments under the Bankrupicy and winding Up Acts, as reported to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics, was experienced in May, 1930. The liabilities of the assignors, however showed an increase. Commercial failures numbered 166 in May, 1930, as compared with 105 in the same month of the previous year, and 194 in April, 1930. The liabilities of the assignors, amounting to \$2,600,755 as compared with \$5,025,102 in April, 1930, showed a considerable decrease; when compared with \$2,294,769 in May, 1929, an increase is noted.

COMMERCIAL FAILURES BY AREAS

MARITIME PROVINCES .- In the month under review, there were 2 assignments in the Maritime Provinces, as compared with 11 in April, 1930, and 11 in May, 1929. The liabilities were about \$20,000.

QUEBEC .- Commercial failures in the Province of Quebec during May, 1930, numbered 60, as against ol in April, 1930, and 82 in the same month of the previous year. The liabilities were approximately \$994,000. Of these 60 failures, 30 with liabilities of about \$795,000 took place in the city of Montreal.

ONTARIO. - In Ontario, the failures numbered 65, as against 72 in April, 1930, and 70 in May, 1929. The liabilities were approximately \$1,065,000. In the city of Toronto, there were 23 failures with liabilities of about \$662,000.

PRAIRIE FROVINCES. - In the three Prairie Frovinces, failures totalled 29 as compared with 25 in April, 1930, and 10 in May of the previous year. The liabilities were about \$355,000, the largest amount being in Alberta. There were 5 failures in the city of Winnipeg, with liabilities of about \$69,000.

BRITISH COLUMBIA. - In British Columbia, commercial failures numbered 10 as compared with 5 in April of the present year and 4 in May, 1930. The liabilities were approximately \$159,000. There were 4 failures in the city of Vancouver, with liabilities in the neighbourhood of 492,000.

COMMERCIAL FAILURES BY BRANCHES OF BUSINESS

TRADE .- Trading establishments furnished the largest number of failures, 82 assigning in May, 1930, as compared with 96 in April, 1930, and 101 in May, 1929. Of these concerns, 9 were general stores, 8 grocery, 10 fish and meat, o dry goods, 7 clothing, 6 automobile, 3 jewelry, 4 coal and wood, and 7 drugs and chemicals.

MANUFACTURES. - Manufacturing establishments to the number of 33 assigned in May, 1930, as against 44 in April, 1930, and 33 in May, 1929. The 33 included 4 engaged in the manufacture of vegetable foods, 5 in fur and leather, 9 clothing, 3 lumber and manufactures, 2 non-ferrous metals, and 2 non-metallic minerals.

AGRICULTURE. - Agriculturists assigning in May, 1930, numbered 7, as compared with 10 in April, 1930, and 17 in May, 1929, a very considerable decrease being noted in the latter comparison.

SISCELLANEOUS. - There were 5 failures in construction, 4 in transportation and public utilities, 20 in service, 1 in mining and 1 in finance.



CUMULATIV: FIVE MONTHS' TOTAL OF FAILURES AND LIABILITIES

The cumulative total of commercial failures for the first five months of 1930 was 1,027, as compared with 1,005, 035, 760 and 715 for the same periods of 1929, 1928, 1927 and 1926 respectively. The total failures in trade for the first five months of 1930, were 527, as compared with 491,350 and 332 for the same periods of 1929, 1928 and 1927; in manufactures 207 for the first five months may be compared with 239, 210 and 179 for the same periods of the three preceding years. The defaulted liabilities for the first five months of 1930 were \$24,002,531, as compared with \$18,069,077, \$11,979,969 and \$11,920,951 for the same periods of the three preceding years. Thus defaulted liabilities showed a considerable increase when compared with the same periods of 1929, 1928 and 1927 respectively.
