## COMGERCIAL FAILURES IN CAIHDA IN HAY, 1930

as com:ared with lay, 1929, a considerable decrease in the number of assignments under the Bankruptcy and winding Up acts, as reforted to the Dominion Eureau of Statistics, was efferienced in May, 1930. The liabilities of the assignors, hovever showed an increase. Commercial failures numbered 166 in Kay, 1930, as compared with 105 in the same month of the previous year, and 194 in April, 1930. The liabilities of the assignors, amounting to $4<, 600,755 \therefore$ a compared with $45,0<5,102$ in april, 1930 , showed a considerablo decrease; when compared with $92,294,769$ in Nay, 1929, an increase is noted.

## COMERCIAL RAILURES BY AREAS

MARITIE PROVINCES. - In the month under reviev, there were $<$ assignments in the kiaritime Provinces, as compared with 11 in myril, 1930, and 11 in fiay, 1949. The liabilities were about $\$ 20,000$.

QUBEC. - Commercial failures in the Frovince of quebec during Way, 1930, numbered 60, as against ol in April, 1930, and 8 c in the same month of the previous year. The liabilities were approximately $\$ 994,000$. Of these 60 failures, 30 with liabilities of abour $\$ 795,000$ took flace in the city of Nontreal.

ONTARIO. - In Ontario, the fallures numbered 65, as abainst $7<$ in $A_{1} r i l$, 1930, and 70 in Lay, 19<9. The liabilities were approximately $\$ 1,65,000$. In the city of Toronto, there ware 43 fillures with liabzlities of about $\$ 66,000$.

PRAIKIE FFROINC:S. - In the three Prairle Frovinces, failures totalled $\angle 9$ as compared with 25 in april, 1930 , and 10 in lay of the previous yoar. The liabilities were about 8355,000 , the largest amount being in Alberta. There mere 5 failures in the city of winnipeg, with liabilities of about 869,000 .

BRIMISH COLUBIA. - In British Columbia, comercial failures numbered 10 as compared with 5 in april of the present year and 4 in May, 1930. The labilitues were approximately 8159,000 . Tiuere vere 4 「ailures in the city of Vancouver, with liabilities in the neighburhood of $9<, 00 \%$.

Thide.- Trading establishments furrished the largest number of failures, $8<$ assifning in May, 1930, as compared aith 96 in April, 1930, and 101 in fay, 1929. Of these concurns, 9 were general stores, 8 grocery, 10 fish and meat, $o$ dry goods, 7 clothing, 6 automobile, 3 jewelry, 4 coal and wood, and 7 drugs and chemicals.

BNUFACTUES, - Nanufacturing establishments to the number of 33 assigned in llay, 1930, as against 44 ir aril. 1930, and 33 in itay, $19<9$. The 33 included 4 engaged in the manufacture of vegaiable ioods, 5 in fur and leather, 9 clothing, 3 lumber and manufactures, c non-ierrous matals, and 2 non-metullic minerals.
nGRICULTUEE.- dericulturists assigning in Why, 1930, numbered 7, as compared with 10 in ipril, 1930, and 17 in thay, 1929, a very considerable decrease being noted in the latier comprison.

减SCELAMDOUS. - There vere 5 failures in construction, 4 in transportation and public utiliries, 20 in service, 1 in mining and $l$ in finance.

## CUIULATIV: FIVE MONTHS TOTAL OF RAILURES AND. LIABILITTES

The cumulativ, total of commercial failures for the first five months of 1930 was 1,027, as compared with $1,005,035,760$ and 715 for the same periods of 1929 , 1928, 1927 and 1926 reapectively. The total failures in trade for the first five months of 1930, were 527, as compared with 491,350 and $33<$ for the same periods of 1929, 1928 and 1927; in manufactures $<07$ for the first five months may be compared with 239,210 and 179 for the same periods of the three preceding years. The defaulted liabilities for the iirst five months of 1930 were $824,002,531$, as compared with §18,069,077, $11,979,969$ and $\$ 11,9<0,951$ for the same periods of the three preceding years. Thus defaulted liabilitios showed a considerable increase when compared with the same periods of 1929,1928 and 1927 respectively.
