

#### COMMERCIAL FILLURES IN CANADA IN AUGUST, 1930.

An increase in the number of assignments under the Bankruptcy and Winding Up Acts, as reported to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics, was experienced in August, 1930, as compared with August, 1929, while the liabilities of the assignors also showed a very considerable increase. Commercial failures numbered 159, as compared with 138 in the same month of the previous year, and 169 in July, 1930. The liabilities of the assignors, amounting to \$5,518,164, as compared with \$1,743,576 in 1929, showed a large increase. When compared with \$2,540,478 in July, 1930, a large increase is again noted. The extraordingrally high figure for liabilities was due to the failure of a large lumbering firm, with liabilities of about \$2,000,000, in British Columbia.

#### COMMERCIAL FAILURES BY AREAS

Maritime Provinces. In the month under review, there were 7 assignments in the Maritime Provinces, as compared with 11 in July, 1930, and 6 in August, 1929. The liabilities in August, 1930, were about \$82,000.

Quebec. - Commercial failures in the Province of Quebec during August, 1930, numbered 59, as against 71 in July, 1930, and 48 in August, 1929. The liabilities were approximately \$881,000. Of these 59 failures, 25 with liabilities of about \$350,000 took place in the city of Montreal.

Ontario. - In Ontario, the failures numbered 47, as against 50 in July, 1930, and 47 in August, 1929. Liabilities aggregated about \$647,000. In the city of Toronto, there were 11 assignments with liabilities of about \$220,000.

Prairie Provinces.— In the three Prairie Provinces, failures increased from 33 in July, 1930, to 40 in August, 1930 and may be compared with 29 in August, 1929. The liabilities were approximately \$1,724,000, mainly in Saskatchewan. The large figure for Saskatchewan was due to the failure of a brokerage house. There were 2 failures in the city of Winnipeg, with liabilities of about \$16,000.

British Columbia. In British Columbia, commercial failures numbered 6 as compared with 5 in July, 1930, and may be compared with 8 in August, 1929. The liabilities reached the high figure of \$2,185,000, owing to the failure of a large lumbering firm. Of these 6 failures, 4 with liabilities of approximately \$149,000 were in the city of Vancouver.


#### FARLURES BY PRANCHES OF BUSINESS

Trade.- Trading esta lishments furnished the largest number of failures, 77 assigning in August, 1930, as compared with 85 in July, 1930, and 66 in August, 1929. Of these concerns, 11 were general stores, 7 grocery, # confectionery, 5 fish and meat, 4 boots and shoes, 9 dry goods, 7 clothing, 4 automobile, 3 electrical apparatus, 2 coal and wood and 3 drugs and chemicals.

Manufactures. - Manufacturing establishments to the number of 30 assigned in August, 1930, as against 35 in July, 1930, and 27 in August, 1929. The 30 included 5 engaged in the manufacture of vegetable foods, 5 in fur and leather goods, 5 in clothing, 3 in lumber and its manufactured products.

Agriculture. - Agriculturists assigning in August, 1930, numbered 10, as compared with 9 in July, 1930, and 6 in August, 1929.

Miscellaneous. There were 5 failures in construction, 2 in transportation and public utilities, and 1 in logging.



#### CUMULATIVE EIGHT MONTHS! TOTAL OF FAILURES AND LIABILITIES

The cumulative total of commercial failures for the first eight months of 1930 was 1,533, as compared with 1,440, 1,249 and 1,166 for the same periods of 1929, 1928 and 1927, respectively. The total failures in trade in the first eight months of 1930 were 773, as compared with \$18,522 and 510 for the same periods of 1929, 1928 and 1927. In manufactures, 311 failures in the elapsed period of 1930, may be compared with 321, 316 and 269 in the same periods of the three preceding years. The defaulted liabilities for the first eight months of 1930 were \$34,466,967 as compared with \$30,952,426, \$18,686,223 and \$18,765,691 for the same periods of the three preceding years, thus showing a considerable increase in the period under review.


