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## OOWERCIAT FIIURES IN: CHNDA IN AUGUST, 1930.

An increase in the number of assignments under the Bankruptcy and Windins Up Acts, as reported to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics, was experienced in Aumust, 1930, as compared with Au ust, 1929, while the liabilities of the assignors also shomed a very considerable increase. Commercial failuros numbered 159, as compared with 138 in the same month of the previous year, and 169, in July, 1930. The liabilitics of the assignore, amounting to $\$ 5,518,164$, as compared with $\$ 1,743,576$ in 1929, showed a large increase. Then compared with $\$ 2,540,478$ in July, 1930, a large increase is again noted. The extraordingrlly high figure for liabilities was due to the failure of a large lumbering firm, with liailities of about $\$ 2,000,000$, in British Columbia.

## COMATMCIAL FAILURES SY AREAS

Maritime Provinces.- In the month under review, there were 7 assignments in the Maritime Provinces, as comared with 11 in July, 1930, and 6 in Ausust, 1929. The liabilities in Aujust, 1930, were about \$82,000.

Quebec. - Commercial failures in the Province of Quejec during August, 1930, numbered 99, as against 71 in July, 1930, and 48 in Ausust, 1929. The liabilities were aun roximatcly $\$ 881,000$. O these 59 failures, 25 with liabilities of about $\$ 350,000$ took place in the city of Montreal.

Ontario. - In Ontario, the failures numbered 47, as against 50 in July, 1930, and 47 in Au ust, 1929. Liavilities agsregeted about $\$ 047,000$. In the city of Toronto, there were 11 assignments with liabilitios of about $\$ 220,000$.

Prai ie Provinces.- In the three Prairie Provinces, failures increased from 33 in July, 1030, to 40 in August, 1930 and may be compared with 29 in August, 1929. The liabilities wore aproximately $\$ 1,724,000$, mainly in Saskatcheran. The large ficure for Saskaichewan was due to tine failure of a brokerage housc. There wore a filures in the city of Minnipes, with liabilities of about $\$ 16,00$.

B-itish Columbia.- In British Columbia, commercial failures numbered ó as comorad with 5 in Iuly, 1930, and may be compared with 8 in Aumust, 1929. Tne liailiities rached the high figure of $\$ 2,185,000$, owing to the failure of a large lumboring firm. Of these 6 failures, 4 with liablities of approximately $\$ 149,000$ vere in the city of Vancouver.

## RIIURES BY ERAHOES OF SUSIIESS

Trade.- Fraind esta lishments "urnished the lareest number of failures, 77 assieninç in Ausust, 1930, as compared with 85 in July, 1930, and 66 in Ausust, 1929. Of these concorns, 11 were Eencral stores, 7 §rocery, $\$$ confectionery, 5 fish and meat, 4 boots and shoes, 9 dry goods, 7 clothin, 4 automoilile, 3 olectrical apparatus, 2 coal and wood and 3 drues ard chemicals.

Monuf ctures.- Manafacturing estalishments to the number of 30 assigned in Aumust, 1930 , as ae inst 35 in July, 1930, and 27 in Aucust, 1929. The 30 included 5 engaged in the manufacture of vegetable foods, 5 in fur and lenther goods, 5 in clothing, 3 in lumber and its manufactured oroducts.

Acwiculture.- Asriculturists assigning in Auwust, 1930, numbered 10, as compared with 9 in July, 1930 and 6 in Aregust, 1929.

Wiscollaneous. Thore were 5 failures in construction, 2 in trensmortation and Tuilic utilities, and in lossing.

The cumulative total of commercial failures for the irst aight months of 1930 was 1,533 , as compared with $1,440,1,249$ nd 1,166 for the sane neriods of 1929,1928 and 1927, resnectively. The total failures in trade in the first eight months of 1930 were 773, as compared with 718,522 and 510 for the same periods of 1929,1928 and 1027. In manufactures, 311 failures in the elapsed jeriod of 1930, may be compared with $32 i$, 316 and 269 in the same yeriods of the three preceding years. The defoulted liabilities for the first eigint months of 1930 were $\$ 34,466,967$ as compared with $\$ 30,952,426$, $\$ 18,686,223$ and $\$ 18,765,691$ for the same periods of the three preceding years, thus showing a considerable increase in the period under reviev.
