COMEACIAL FAILUPES II CAIADA IN SEPTENEEK, 1930.
An increase in the number of assignments under the bankruptcy and wincing Up Acts, as reported to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics, was experienced ir September, 1930 , as compared with September, 1929, while the liabilities of the assignors also showed an increase. Commscial failures numbered 19人, as compared with 150 in the same morth of the previous year, and 159 in sugust, 1930. The liabilities of the assignors, amourtirg to $\$ 2,081,447$, as compared with $\$ 1,710,194$ in September, 1929, alsu showed an increase. when compared with $\$ 5,518,164$ in fugust, 1930, a large decrease is noted.

## COMMERCIAL FAILURES BY AREAS

Waritime Provinces. - In the month under review, there vere 5 assignments in the Maritime Provinces, as compared with 7 in August, 1930, and 5 in September, 1949. The liabilities in September, 1930, were about $\$ 26,000$.

Quebec. - Commercial failures in the Province of quebec during September, 1930, numbered 86, as against 59 in August, 1930, and 66 in September, 19<9. The liabilities were approximately $\$ 812,000$. Of these 86 failures, 44 with liabilities of about $\$ 403,000$ took place in the city of Montreal.

Ontario. - In Ontario, the failures numbered 68, as against 47 in August, 1930, and 57 in September, 1929. Liabilities aggregated about $\$ 879,000$. In the city of Toronto, there were 14 lailures with liabilities of about $\$ 94,000$.

Prairie Provinces. - In the three Prairie Provinces, failures decreased from 40 in August, 1930 , to 26 in September, 1930 , and may be compared with lo in September, 1949. The liabilities were approximately $\$ 187,000$. There were 5 iailures in the city of winnipe $\overline{6}$ ith liabilities of a 50 ut $\$ 53,000$.

British Columbia. - In British Columbiá, commercial iailures numbered 7 as compared with 6 in August, 1930 , and 5 in September, 19.9 . The liabilities were about $\$ 176,000$. Of the se 7 failures, 3 with liabilities of approximately $\$ 107,000$ were in the city of Vancouver.

## FAILURIS BY BE:ANCHES OF BUSINESS

Trade. - Trading establishments furnished the largest number of failures, 97 assignirg in September, 1930, as compared with 77 in August, 1930, and 72 in September, 1929. Of these concerns, 12 were general stores, 10 grocery, 5 confectionery, 6 fish and meat, 7 boots and shoes, 9 dry goods , 10 clothing, 5 books und stationery, 3 automobile, 5 electrical apparatus, $\angle$ jewelry anc 5 coal and wood.

Manufactures. - Manufacturing establishments to the number of 40 assigned in September, 1930, as uainst 30 in August, 1930, and 25 in September, 1929. The 40 included 6 engaged in the manufacture of vegetable foods, 3 in animal foods, 7 in fur and leather, 3 in textiles, 5 in clothing, 3 in lumber and its manufactured products and 3 in non-ferrous metals.

Agriculture. - Agriculturists assigning in September, 1930, numbered 8, as compared with 10 in August, 1930, and 8 in September, 1929.

Misceilaneous. - The re were 4 failures in consiruction, 5 in transportation and public utilities, and 2 in innanes.

## CUMLATIVE NIIL NONTHS' TOTAL OR FAILURES AND LIABILITIES

The cumulative total of commercial failures for the first nine months of 1930 was 2,725 , as compared with $1,589,1,414$ and 1,294 for the same periods of 1929, 1928 and $19<7$ respectively. The total failures in trade in the first nine months of 1930 were 870 , as compared with 791,601 and 571 for the same periods of 1929 , $19<8$ and 1927. In manufactures, 351 iailures in the elapsed foriod of 1930, may be compared with $346,35<$ and 298 in the same periods of the throe preceding years. The defaulted liabilities for the first rine months of 1930 wert $\$ 36,648,414$, as compared with $\$ 26,618,648, ~ W 20,756,502$ and $\$ 20,865,970$ for the same puriods of the three preceding years, thus showing a considerable increaso in the period under reviow.
