

#### COMMERCIAL FAILURES IN CANADA IN JANUARY, 1931

As compared with January, 1930, a decrease in the number of assignments under the Bankruptcy and Winding Up Acts, as reported to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics, was experienced in January, 1931, while the liabilities of the assignors also showed a decrease. Commercial failures numbered 240 in January, 1931, as compared with 261 in the same month of the previous year, and 239 in December, 1930. The liabilities of the assignors, amounting to \$3,970,679 as compared with \$4,202,599 in December, 1930, showed a decrease; when compared with \$8,661,100 in January, 1930, a considerable decrease is noted.

#### Commercial Failures by Areas

Maritime Provinces. - In the month under review, there were 16 assignments in the Maritime Provinces, as compared with 11 in December, 1930, and 20 in January, 1930. The liabilities in January, 1931, were about \$129,000.

Quebec. - Commercial failures in the Province of Quebec during January, 1931, numbered 80 as against 98 in December, 1930, and 120 in January, 1930. The liabilities were approximately \$1,108,000. Of these 80 failures, 42 with liabilities of about \$632,000 took place in the city of Montreal.

Ontario. In Ontario, the failures numbered 87, as against 76 in December, 1930, and 81 in January, 1930. Liabilities aggregated about \$1,817,000. In the city of Toronto, there were 22 assignments, with liabilities of about \$698,000.

Prairie Provinces. - In the three Prairie Provinces, failures increased from 43 in December, 1930, to 46 in January, 1931, and may be compared with 32 in January, 1930. The liabilities were approximately \$594,000. There were 6 failures in the city of Winnipeg with liabilities of about \$149,000.

British Columbia. In British Columbia, commercial failures numbered 11 as compared with 11 in December, 1930, and 8 in January, 1930. The liabilities were approximately \$322,000. Of these 11 failures, 5 with liabilities of about \$134,000 were in the city of Vancouver.

#### Failures by Branches of Business


Trade. Trading establishments furnished the largest number of failures, 121 assigning in January, 1931, as compared with 126 in December, 1930, and 135 in January, 1930. Of these concerns, 13 were general stores, 12 grocery, 8 confectionery, 7 fish and meat, 8 boots and shoes, 10 dry goods, 16 clothing, 8 furniture, 4 hardware, 2 jewelry and 5 coal and wood.

Manufactures. - Manufacturing establishments to the number of 48 assigned in January, 1931, as against 47 in December, 1930, and 58 in January, 1930, a decrease of about 17 p.c. in the latter comparison. The 48 included 9 engaged in vegetable foods, 3 in animal foods, 6 in fur and leather, 8 in clothing, 3 in lumber and its manufactured products, and 3 in the manufacture of non-metallic minerals.

Agriculture. - Agriculturists assigning in January, 1931, numbered 5 as compared with 9 in December, 1930, and 6 in January, 1930.

Miscellaneous. - There were 2 failures in fishing and trapping, 7 in construction, 3 in transportation and public utilities and 3 in finance.


Statistical Tables. The commercial failures in each month from January, 1928, are given by provinces in Table 1, while Table 2 furnishes statistics of commercial failures by branches of business by months from January, 1928 to January, 1931. The detailed figures of failures during January, 1931, are shown by provinces and branches of business in Table 3. The assets and liabilities of those failing during January, 1931, are shown by provinces in Table 4.




