

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COMMERCIAL FAILURES IN CANADA IN NOVEMBER, 1931.

A decrease in the number of assignments under the Bankruptcy and Winding Up Act's, as reported to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics, was experienced in November, 1931, as compared with November, 1930, while the liabilities of the assignors showed an increase. Commercial failures numbered 213 as compared with 222 in the same month of the previous year, and with 226 in October, 1931. The liabilities of the assignors, amounting to \$4,335,646 in November, 1931, showed a considerable decrease when compared with \$12,378,396 in October, 1931. When compared with \$3,295,951 in November, 1930, an increase is noted.

COMMERCIAL FAILURES BY AREAS

Maritime Provinces.- In the month under review, there were 7 assignments in the Maritime Provinces, as compared with 9 in October, 1931, and 6 in November, 1930. The liabilities in November, 1931, were about \$40,000.

Quebec.- Commercial failures in the province of Quebec during November, 1931, numbered 78 as against 98 in October, 1931, and 86 in November, 1930. The liabilities were approximately \$1,617,000. In the city of Montreal, there were 46 failures with liabilities of about \$1,200,000.

Ontario.- In Ontario, the failures numbered 82, as against 78 in October, 1931, and 65 in November, 1930. Liabilities aggregated about \$1,749,000. Of these 82 failures, 24 with liabilities of about \$869,000 took place in the city of Toronto.

Prairie Provinces.- In the three Prairie Provinces, failures decreased from 28 in October, 1931, to 26 in November, 1931, and may be compared with 55 in November, 1930. The liabilities were approximately \$775,000. In the city of Winnipeg there were 8 failures with liabilities in the neighbourhood of \$524,000.

British Columbia.- In British Columbia, commercial failures numbered 13 as compared with 13 in October, 1931, and 10 in November, 1930. The liabilities were approximately \$154,000. There were 8 failures in the city of Vancouver with liabilities of about \$122,000.

FAILURES BY BRANCHES OF BUSINESS

Trade.- Trading establishments furnished the largest number of failures, 104 assigning in November, 1931, as compared with 107 in October, 1931, and 101 in November, 1930. Of these concerns, 14 were general stores, 11 grocery, 8 confectionery, 4 fish and meat, 6 boots and shoes, 7 dry goods, 10 clothing, 6 furniture, 3 automobile, 3 hardware, 5 electric apparatus, 3 jewelry, 4 coal and wood and 4 drugs and chemicals.

Manufactures.- Manufacturing establishments to the number of 37 assigned in November, 1931, as against 45 in October, 1931, and 46 in November, 1930. The 37 included 6 engaged in the manufacture of vegetable foods, 3 in animal foods, 5 in fur and leather, 6 in clothing, and 3 lumber and its manufactured products.

Agriculture.- Agriculturists assigning in November, 1931, numbered 17, as compared with 15 in October, 1931, and 14 in November, 1930.

Miscellaneous.- There were 4 failures in garages, 4 in customs and repairs, 11 in personal service and 6 in business service.

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CUMULATIVE ELEVEN MONTHS' TOTAL OF FAILURES AND LIABILITIES

The cumulative total of commercial failures for the first eleven months of 1931 was 2,020, as compared with 2,163, 1,943 and 1,807 for the same periods of 1930, 1929 and 1928, respectively. The total failures in trade in the first eleven months of 1931 were 1,001 as compared with 1,078, 977 and 760 for the same periods of 1930, 1929 and 1928. In manufactures, 425 failures in the elapsed period of 1931, may be compared with 441, 400 and 454 in the same periods of the three preceding years. The defaulted liabilities for the first eleven months of 1931 were \$49,595,665, as compared with \$43,361,466, \$35,166,130 and \$27,183,163 for the same periods of the three preceding years.

The assets and liabilities of those failing during November, 1931, are shown by provinces in Table 4.
